Beginning with Duke's 21-18 win over Tennessee to open the 1976 campaign, Harris has worked 406 consecutive Blue Devil gridiron tilts entering the 2012 season ... Harris was honored in 2011 with the North Carolina Broadcaster of the Year accolade, marking the third time he has received the award (1988 & 1991)
- The 2012 season will mark analyst **Wes Chesson's** 33rd year providing color commentary ... Chesson, an All-ACC receiver during his playing tenure from 1968-70, continues to hold the school single-season record for receptions with 74 in 1970, and finished his career with 164 catches for 2,399 yards and 10 touchdowns ... He went on to play with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons and Philadelphia Eagles
- **Anthony Dilweg**, the 1988 ACC Player of the Year, joins the broadcast team for his 14th season, serving as the sideline reporter ... The former Duke quarterback established school single-season records for passing yards (3,824) and touchdowns (24) in 1988 and was a third round selection of the Green Bay Packers in the 1989 NFL Draft
- The one-hour tailgate show is hosted by **John Roth** while **John Rose** is the network engineer

DUKE CELEBRATES 100TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL IN 2012

- The 2012 campaign marks the 100th season for the Duke football program
- Since starting play in the fall of 1888, Duke has compiled an overall record of 459-483-31 in its 99 seasons
- Duke did not field a team between 1895-1919
- The 2012 season-opener versus FIU will mark Duke's 974th game
- Duke Stadium opened on October 5, 1929 and was later renamed Wallace Wade Stadium in 1967 in honor of the Hall of Fame head coach ... Wade guided the Blue Devils to a 110-36-7 record in 16 seasons (1931-41; 1946-50) and was enshrined into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1955
- The Blue Devils have been a member of two conferences — Southern (1930-52) and Atlantic Coast (1953-present)
- Duke has captured 17 conference championships (10 Southern & 7 ACC) and has finished 16 seasons ranked in the final Associated Press national poll
- The Blue Devils have played in eight bowl games including the Rose (1939 & 1942), Sugar (1945), Orange (1955 & 1958), Cotton (1961), All American (1989) and Hall of Fame (1995)
- Due to the attack on Pearl Harbor in December of 1941, Duke played host to the Rose Bowl on January 1, 1942

- The school boasts 12 members of the College Football Hall of Fame including nine former players (Fred Crawford, Al DeRogatis, Dan Hill, Clarkston Hines, Steve Lach, George McAfee, Mike McGee, Ace Parker & Eric Tipton) and three former coaches (Howard Jones, Bill Murray & Wallace Wade)
- Duke has three football alumni enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame: Sonny Jurgensen, George McAfee & Ace Parker

- In 1959, Mike McGee received the Outland Trophy as the top interior lineman in the nation
- Twenty-seven Blue Devils have received first team All-America honors including four consensus selections (Fred Crawford, Ace Parker, Ernie Jackson & Clarkston Hines)
- Duke has registered a league-best 10 ACC Player of the Year citations by Jerry Barger (1954), Mike McGee (1959), Jay Wilkinson (1963), Ernie Jackson (1971), Steve Jones (1972), Chris Castor (1982), Ben Bennett (1983), Anthony Dilweg (1988), Clarkston Hines (1989) & Robert Baldwin (1994)
- Three Blue Devils coaches — Bill Murray (1954-60-62), Steve Spurrier (1988-89) and Fred Goldsmith (1994) — earned ACC Coach of the Year honors
