# **2011 NOTEBOOK**

### DANIELS EARNS ALL-AMERICA HONORS

- Senior safety Matt Daniels earned second team All-America honors from the American Football Coaches Association. He became the third Duke defensive back to earn All-America honors and the first since Ray Farmer in 1994.
- Daniels ranked second in the ACC in tackles with 126 total stops while adding 4.0 tackles for loss, 14 pass break-ups and two interceptions on the year. A first team All-ACC selection, Daniels finished third in the balloting for the league's Defensive Player of the Year award after registering the 23rd-highest singleseason tackle total in school history.
- Daniels reached double figures in the tackle column five times in 2011 including a career-best 18-stop performance in his final collegiate game at North Carolina.
   In addition, his pass break-up total of 14 marking the second-highest single-season total in school history.

#### **CLOSE GAMES**

- Duke played six one-possession games (contests decided by 8 points or less) in 2011 with an average margin of difference of 3.17 points. The six games tied for the sixth most in the nation.
- The Blue Devils had one-possession wins over Boston College (20-19) and FIU (31-27) and losses to Richmond (23-21), Wake Forest (24-23), Virginia Tech (14-10) and Georgia Tech (38-31).

#### TOMLINSON NAMED FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA

- Redshirtfreshman guard Laken Tomlinson received Freshman All-America first team honors from *Sporting News* after a season in which he started all 12 games and played the second most snaps on the team (926).
- Amember of the Blue Devil offensive front that ranked third in the league in sacks allowed per passing attempt (25.95), Tomlinson helped protect quarterback Sean Renfree, who established a new school single-season record for completion percentage (.650) while ranking second in the ACC in passing yardage.
- Tomlinson became just the sixth player in Duke football history to earn Freshman All-America first team honors. With his selection, Duke has placed at least one player on a Freshman All-America team for nine consecutive seasons.

#### FOUR RECEIVE ALL-ACC HONORS

- Senior safety Matt Daniels earned All-ACC first team honors, headlining a group of four Blue Devils who earned all-league recognition. Senior punter Alex King and junior wide receiver Conner Vernon received second team honors, while senior tight end Cooper Helfet earned honorable mention recognition.
- Daniels finished tops among ACC defensive backs and third overall in the league in tackles per game (10.5) after posting 126 total stops on the year. He added 4.0 tackles for loss, two interceptions, one caused fumble and 14 pass break-ups the second-highest single-season PBU total in Duke history. Daniels, who finished his 46-game career with 324 tackles, 13.0 tackles for loss, 27 pass break-ups, four interceptions, seven caused fumbles and three fumble recoveries, was the first Blue Devil safety to earn first team all-league honors since **Ray Farmer** turned the trick in back-to-back seasons in 1994-95.

- King punted 50 times for 2,104 yards and a 42.08 yards per kick average. With the third highest punting average in the ACC, King placed 17 boots inside the opponent 20-yard line against just four touchbacks. His season average was the ninth-best in school history.
- Vernon earned second team honors for the second straight year after posting 70 receptions for 956 yards and six touchdowns — all team bests. In 2011, Vernon matched the school single-season record for most games (9) with five or more catches while becoming the first player in ACC history to post multiple seasons with 70 or more receptions. Through three seasons, he has 198 catches for 2,675 yards and 13 touchdowns to rank second on Duke's career charts in both receptions and yardage and tied for eighth in TDs.
- Helfet picked up an honorable mention citation for the second year in a row after catching 43 passes for 395 yards and four touchdowns. Among Duke tight ends, his 43 grabs were the most since 1994 while matching the seventh-highest single-season total. Helfet finished his 23-game career with 77 catches for 775 yards and six touchdowns.

### DANIELS PLAYS IN EAST-WEST SHRINE GAME

- Senior Matt Daniels represented Duke in the East-West Shrine Game in St. Petersburg, Fla. He was the 35th former Duke player to participate in the prestigious event, which began in 1925 and benefits Shriners Hospitals for Children.
- Seniors Danny Parker and Donovan Varner also played in all-star games with Parker participating in the AstroTurf NFLPA Collegiate Bowl in Carson, Calif., and Varner playing in the Battle of Florida in Boca Raton, Fla.

### **DUKE NAMES FOUR CAPTAINS**

• Matt Daniels, Charlie Hatcher, Kyle Hill and Sean Renfree captained the Duke football team in 2011.

### DANIELS EARNS ACC POSTGRAD SCHOLARSHIP

- The Atlantic Coast Conference honored senior Matt Daniels with the Weaver-James-Corrigan Honorary Award for his performance on the field and in the classroom throughout his Duke career.
- The Weaver-James-Corrigan and Jim and Pat Thacker scholarships are awarded to selected studentathletes who intend to pursue a graduate degree, and the honorary award Daniels received was one of six the ACC awarded to student-athletes who intend to compete at the professional level.
- Daniels posted a 3.264 grade point average as a public policy major, was a two-time selection to the Academic All-ACC Team and a four-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

### **DUKE PLACES 19 ON ACADEMIC ALL-ACC TEAM**

- Led by All-America safety Matt Daniels, Duke placed a league-high 19 players on the Academic All-ACC Team.
- Daniels was one of nine repeat picks from Duke, joining Kelby Brown, Ross Cockrell, Dave Harding, Cooper Helfet, Sean Renfree, Perry Simmons, Will Snyderwine and Donovan Varner. Daniels and Snyderwine were three-time selections to the squad.

 Also representing the Blue Devils were Brandon Braxton, Jordon Byas, John Coleman, Braxton Deaver, C.J. France, Charlie Hatcher, David Helton, Dezmond Johnson, Laken Tomlinson and Juwan Thompson.

### DANIELS NAMED DUKE TEAM MVP

- Senior safety **Matt Daniels** was named Duke's Most Valuable Player at the team's annual football banquet.
- Other honorees included Kelby Brown (Mike Curtis Award & Mike Suglia Award), Jordon Byas (Bill Keziah Award), Ross Cockrell (Sonny Falcone Iron Duke Award), Braxton Deaver (Sonny Falcone Iron Duke Award), Jeffrey Faris (Micah Harris Trinity Teammate Award), Dave Harding (Ace Parker Award & Frances Cutcliffe Spirit of Perseverance Award), Charlie Hatcher (Steve Brooks Captain Award & Mike McGee Award), Kyle Hill (Steve Brooks Captain Award & Dan "Tiger" Hill Award), Alex King (Bill Keziah Award), Sean Renfree (Steve Brooks Captain Award), Cody Robinson (Sonny Falcone Iron Duke Award), Perry Simmons (K.D. Kennedy Iron Devil Award), Juwan Thompson (Bob Pascal Award) and Donovan Varner (Clarkston Hines Award).

### DUKE PASSING GAME AMONG ACC'S BEST

- Duke's passing game was among the best in the ACC, ranking second in the league with an average of 272.2 yards per game. Duke led the league in pass completions (315) and attempts (493) for a 69.3 completion percentage.
- Led by quarterback Sean Renfree, Duke threw for 3,266 yards which ranks as the fifth highest total in school history.
- Renfree set Duke's single-season completion percentage record, completing 282-of-434 passes for a 65.0 percent completion percentage, 2,891 yards and 14 touchdowns.
- Senior wide receiver **Donovan Varner** and junior **Conner Vernon** were major contributors as well as both ranked among the ACC's top 10 in receptions per game. Varner became Duke's all-time receiving leader and wrapped up his career ranking second on the ACC's all-time list with 207 career receptions. Vernon finished just shy of reaching the 200-reception plateau and will enter his senior season ranking fourth on the ACC's all-time list with 198 career catches. Vernon and Varner combined for 131 receptions, 1,669 receiving yards and nine receiving touchdowns in 2011.
- All-ACC tight end Cooper Helfet contributed as well, finishing third on the team with 43 receptions for 395 yards and four touchdowns.

#### VARNER & VERNON LEAVE AS ACC'S BEST DUO

- The wide receiver pair of Donovan Varner and Conner Vernon became the ACC's all-time leading receiving duo in 2011.
- The Miami natves combined for 384 receptions, 5,171 yards and 25 touchdowns during their three seasons together. Those numbers best the previous record of a combined 364 receptions by Clemson's Aaron Kelly and Tyler Grisham and the previous Duke record of 357 by Clarkston Hines and Roger Boone.
- Both Varner and Vernon rank among the top five on the ACC's all-time receptions list and among the top 10 on the all-time receiving yardage list.

#### RENFREE SETS COMPLETION RECORD

- Renfree set Duke's single-game record for completions in the 20-19 win over Boston College on Sept. 17, 2011.
- Renfree went 41-for-53 for 368 yards and two touchdowns to break Thaddeus Lewis' record of 40 completions set against N.C. State in 2009.
- Renfree became only the second Duke quarterback to complete 40 passes in a game.

### RENFREE REACHES 6,000 CAREER PASS YARDS

- Duke redshirt junior QB Sean Renfree surpassed 6,000 passing yards for his career in 2011 and enters his senior season with 6,352 passing yards, the fifth highest total in Duke history.
- Renfree is only the sixth Duke QB to reach the 6,000-yard plateau. Duke's two most recent QBs to reach 6,000 yards — Renfree and Thaddeus Lewis — were mentored by head coach David Cutcliffe.

#### VARNER GRABS 60+ CATCHES FOR 3RD SEASON

- Donovan Varner made ACC history as a senior when he caught 61 passes, giving him three consecutive seasons with at least 60 receptions.
- Varner is the first player in league history to post three straight seasons of at least 60 receptions. He had 65 for 1,047 yards as a sophomore, 60 for 736 yards as a junior and 61 for 713 yards as a senior.
- Only 12 other players in ACC history have caught 60 passes in two separate season including teammate Conner Vernon.

### VERNON GRABS 70 PASSES FOR SECOND YEAR

- Conner Vernon led Duke with 70 receptions as a junior, giving him at least 70 catches in back-to-back seasons.
- Vernon became the first player in ACC history to post consecutive 70-reception seasons. Entering his senior season, Vernon sits 10 receptions shy of breaking Duke's all-time reception record and 35 away from surpassing the ACC mark.

#### SCORING ON THE GROUND

- Duke scored 19 touchdowns on the ground in 2011, matching the 2010 total for the most rushing touchdowns since 1995 (21). Duke scored on the ground in its first 10 games, including five contests with multiple rushing scores.
- Sophomore RB Juwan Thompson had seven rushing scores the highest total by a Duke running back since 2005 when Justin Boyle scored nine times on the ground.
- Thompson ran in two of Duke's five rushing scores in a 48-27 win over Tulane on Sept. 24, 2011.
- Quarterbacks Anthony Boone and Sean Renfree also accounted for four rushing touchdowns apiece.

### HARRIS NAMED NC SPORTSCASTER OF YEAR

 Bob Harris, the voice of Duke football since 1976, was named the North Carolina Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. It marked the third time that Harris received the award, also earning it in 1988 and 1991.

#### NEW SCHEME IMPROVES RUSH DEFENSE

- In its first full year under the 4-2-5 defensive scheme, Duke's run defense improved dramatically. The Blue Devils held opponents to 180.7 rushing yards per game, which was 28 fewer yards than the Blue Devils gave up in 2010.
- The scheme allowed safeties Matt Daniels and Walt Canty to make plays in the running game, and those two finished the year as Duke's top two tackles. Daniels ranked third in the ACC with 126 stops while Canty finished 14th in the league with 87 tackles.
- Linebacker Kelby Brown ranked third on the team with 65 tackles and first with 7.0 tackles for loss.

### DANIELS TOPS 300-TACKLE PLATEAU

- Matt Daniels became just the 14th player in school history to record 300 career tackles. Daniels finished his four years at Duke with 324 stops to rank 13th on Duke's all-time list.
- Daniels recorded a career-high 126 tackles as a senior which ranked as the 23rd highest total in school history and the second most by a Duke defensive back. Only **Erwin Sampson** (1988-91) recorded more tackles in a season and a career than Daniels from a defensive back position.

### **DANIELS & HELFET SIGN PRO CONTRACTS**

- Senior safety **Matt Daniels** signed a free agent contract with the St. Louis Rams in the National Football League.
- Senior tight end **Cooper Helfet** also signed a free agent deal with the Seattle Seahawks.

### CROWDER MAKES IMPACT IN RETURN GAME

- True freshman **Jamison Crowder** ranked fifth in the ACC in yards per kickoff return, averaging 21.8 yards per return.
- Crowder took the ball at least 20 yards in 26 of his 38 kickoff returns, including a career-long 35 yarder against Wake Forest.
- Crowder led Duke in all-purpose yards, averaging 95.1 yards per game. He totaled 814 on kickoff returns, 163 receiving, 122 on punt returns and 42 rushing.
- Crowder entered Duke's record books against Stanford with 190 all-purpose yards. He posted 134 kickoff return yards, 47 receiving yards and nine rushing yards to give him the seventh highest single game total for all-purpose yards by a freshman at Duke.

### KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Duke was among the best in the country in kickoff return defense and ranked third nationally with 17.53 yards allowed per return.
- Duke's opponents took only six of Duke's 51 kickoffs back more than 25 yards and none longer than 35 yards. Six of those kickoffs yielded touchbacks.

## **SNYDERWINE & SCORING RECORDS**

- Will Snyderwine finished his career ranked second on Duke's career field goal list with 46 and third on the all-time scoring list with 222 points.
- A former walk-on, Snyderwine also set the school record by hitting 81 consecutive PATs during his career. Snyderwine was a perfect 81-for-81 during his Duke career.

## Richmond 23, Duke 21

September 3, 2011 • Durham, N.C.

 Richmond QB Aaron Corp threw for 193 yards and one TD to lead visiting Richmond to a 23-21 victory over Duke in front of 32,741 fans at Wallace Wade Stadium

- Trailing 23-21 in the fourth period, the Blue Devils missed a pair of field goals from 28 and 60 yards in the final two minutes of the game
- The Blue Devils scored three TDs on the ground as RB Desmond Scott (29 yards), QB Brandon Connette (6) and QB Anthony Boone (3) found the end zone
- Duke S Matt Daniels matched a school single-game record with six pass breakups, equalling the standard set by Quinton McCracken vs. N.C. State in 1989 ... Daniels also moved into a tie for 10th place on Duke's all-time listing for career PBUs with 19 (Deonto McCormick, 2002-06)
- Duke WR **Donovan Varner** caught four passes for 60 yards to become the seventh player in school history to amass over 2,000 career receiving yards (2,007)
- Duke RB **Juwan Thompson** rushed for a career-high 86 yards on 14 attempts
- With his three PATs, Duke K Will Snyderwine pushed his streak of consecutive extra points to 59 -- matching the school's second-longest streak (Randy Garnder, 1991-92)
- Three true freshmen WR Jamison Crowder, WR Blair Holliday, LB Britton **Grier** — saw playing time for the Blue Devils

- Stanford QB Andrew Luck threw for 290 yards and four TD to lead No. 6 Stanford to a 44-14 win over Duke in front of 24,785 at Wallace Wade Stadium
- After Duke S Lee Butler scored on a 76-vard interception return to pull Duke to within 10-7 late in the second period, the Cardinal rattled off 34 unanswered points over the next 22:39
- Butler's return for a score marked the 10th-longest INT return in school history
- Luck finished 20-of-28 through the air with four TDs and one INT while WR Chris Awusu caught seven passes for 106 yards and one TD
- Duke QB Sean Renfree was 19-of-27 passing for 179 yards
- S Matt Daniels led the Blue Devils with 13 tackles
- WR Jamison Crowder amassed 190 all-purpose yards (134 KOR, 47 REC & 9 RUSH) to post the seventh-highest single-game total by a freshman in Duke history ... His six kick-off returns matched the second-highest single-game total by a rookie in school history

# Duke 20, Boston College 19

September 17, 2011 • Chestnut Hill, Mass.

• Duke QB **Sean Renfree** scored the game-winning touchdown on a one-yard plunge with 9:57 left in the fourth period to lift the Blue Devils to a 20-19 road league win over Boston College in front of 35,812 fans at Alumni Stadium in Chestnut Hill, Mass.

- Renfree hit on 41-of-53 passes -- setting the school single-game record for completions -- for a career-high 368 yards and two TDs
- Boston College K Nate Freese missed a 23-yard field goal attempt with 43 seconds left in the game
- Duke's defense held the Eagles to zero points and just 108 total yards in the second half as Boston College punted five times and attempted a field goal on its six possessions
- Duke WR Conner Vernon caught six passes for 116 yards and two TDs while fellow receiver Donovan Varner had a career-high 12 receptions for 78 yards
- Five Blue Devils had at least six catches and 50 receoving yards as Renfree posted the 10th-highest single-game pass completion percentage (.769)
