# 2014 DUKE FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

## A SECOND STRAIGHT NINE-WIN SEASON

- With a 41-21 victory against Wake Forest on November 29, Duke earned its ninth win of the season.
- The victory marked the first time in Duke history the Blue Devils won nine or more games in consecutive seasons. The 2013 squad tallied a program-record 10 triumphs.
- With 10 victories in 2013 and nine in 2014, the Blue Devils posted consecutive winning seasons for the first time since 1988 (7-3-1) and 1989 (8-4).
- Duke's nine wins marked the program's sixth campaign with nine or more victories, but only the second since 1940, joining the 2013 squad.

## BOWLING THREE STRAIGHT YEARS

- The Blue Devils played in a bowl game in three straight years for the first time in program history.
- Duke had never appeared in consecutive bowl games until the 2012-13 seasons.
- The Hyundai Sun Bowl was Duke's 11th bowl appearance and third since the 1994 season.
- The Blue Devils are 3-8 in bowl appearances. Duke's last bowl win was a 7-6 victory against Arkansas on January 2, 1961, in the Cotton Bowl.
- Duke's all-time record in seasons following a bowl is 64-38-2 with winning records in all but the 1958 (5-5), 1990 (4-7) and 1995 (3-8) seasons.

## THE WINNINGEST TWO YEARS AT DUKE

- The 10 wins in 2013 and nine in 2014 gave Duke the winningest two-year stretch in program history. A closer look at the Blue Devils' winningest consecutive seasons:

- Duke won six games in 2012, 10 in 2013 and nine in 2014 to match the program's winningest three-year stretch. A closer look at the winningest three consecutive seasons at Duke:

## A PROGRAM TURNING THE PAGE

- Duke has tallied 25 wins in the past three seasons. In the previous nine seasons, from 2003-11, Duke recorded 25 victories.

## DUKE WITH VOTES FOR 25 STRAIGHT WEEKS

- The Blue Devils have been ranked or receiving votes in one or both national polls for 25 consecutive editions, since the October 27, 2013, polls.
- Before that stretch, Duke had not received votes in any regular season poll since October 7, 2012.

## DUKE CRACKS BOTH NATIONAL POLLS IN 2014

- Duke climbed as high as No. 19 in both the *Associated Press* and *Amway Coaches* polls heading into the Virginia Tech game on November 15. It was the highest AP ranking for the Blue Devils in more than 10 years, since checking in 19th before the November 12, 1994, game versus N.C. State.

## BLUE DEVILS AS A RANKED TEAM IN 2014

- With a 2-1 ledger in 2014, Duke won two or more games as a ranked team in consecutive years for the first time since the 1954-55 seasons.
- The Blue Devils played a game as a ranked team in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1956-57.
- Against Virginia Tech on November 15, Duke played its first home game as a top-20 team since November 5, 1960.

## DUKE TAKES DOWN ANOTHER RANKED FOE

- With a 31-25 victory at No. 22 Georgia Tech on October 11, Duke recorded a road win against a ranked opponent in consecutive years for the first time since 1970-71. In 2013, the Blue Devils defeated No. 16 Virginia Tech, 13-10, in Blacksburg.
- Duke's three total wins against ranked teams in the past two years (No. 16 Virginia Tech & No. 24 Miami in 2013) were the most in a two-year stretch since the Blue Devils claimed three in 1970-71.

## BLUE DEVILS APPEAR IN CFP RANKINGS

- In addition to ranking in both national polls in 2014, Duke appeared in three of the College Football Playoff rankings.
- The Blue Devils peaked at No. 21 in the third CFP rankings. Duke was No. 22 in the second set and No. 24 in the initial rankings.

## 2014 SENIOR CLASS AMONG THE BEST AT DUKE

- With 28 victories in the past four years, the 2014 senior class tied the 1963 seniors as the winningest group since 1956 and tied for the 12th winningest in Blue Devil history. A closer look at the winningest senior classes at Duke:

## TWO BUT NOT THREE

- Duke has not had a three-game losing streak in consecutive seasons, a first since 1988-89.
- Prior to head coach David Cutcliffe's arrival, Duke had lost 22 straight games from September 24, 2005 - September 8, 2007.

## DUKE'S BEST TWO YEAR STRETCH IN THE ACC

- Duke earned its fifth ACC win against Wake Forest to clinch its first consecutive winning league seasons since 1960-65.
- The 2014 campaign was the ninth since joining the ACC in 1953 that Duke reached five or more league wins.
- Duke finished with at least five ACC wins in consecutive years for the first time since 1960-63.
- The Blue Devils' past two years in the ACC have produced 11 wins, tied for the most in a two year span in program history.
- From 1999-2011, Duke won just 12 ACC games.

## CONSECUTIVE TOP-TWO FINISHES

- Duke won the ACC Coastal Division championship in 2013 and placed second in the division in 2014, just one game behind Georgia Tech.
- Before last season, Duke had not finished above fifth in the Coastal since divisional play began in 2005.
- The Blue Devils joined the ACC in 1953 and had not finished within the top two of the league in consecutive years since capturing three straight championships from 1960-62.

## TOMLINSON A CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICA

- In 2014 Duke right guard **Laken Tomlinson** became just the fifth Blue Devil to be named a consensus All-America, joining **Fred Crawford** (1933), **Ace Parker** (1936), **Ernie Jackson** (1971) and **Clarkston Hines** (1989).
- Tomlinson was named to eight All-America teams, the most by any player in a year in Duke history. He was a first team selection by the *Associated Press (AP)* and *Walter Camp Foundation (WCF)*, a second team honoree by *USA Today*, *Athlon Sports* and *Sporting News*, a third team choice by *Phil Steele Magazine* and *Lindy's* and an honorable mention pick by *Sports Illustrated*.
- The Blue Devils' last first team All-America honoree was **Will Snyderwine** in 2010 (*American Football Coaches Association*).
- Duke's last *WCF* and *AP* first team All-American was **Clarkston Hines** in 1989.
- Tomlinson became the first Blue Devil to receive two first team All-America honors in the same season since punter **Brian Morton** in 2000. Tomlinson was Duke's first offensive player to receive two first team selections since **Hines** in 1989.

## TWO WALTER CAMP ALL-AMERICA HONOREES

- **Tomlinson** and safety **Jeremy Cash** (second team) both received *WCF* All-America honors.
- It was the first time Duke had two *WCF* All-Americans in the same year.

## CASH REPEATS AS ALL-AMERICAN

- **Cash** received 2013 All-America honors (*USA Today* second team) to become Duke's first All-American in consecutive years since **Hines** in 1988-89.
- **Cash** is Duke's first defensive player to receive All-America accolades in consecutive years since **Keith Stoneback** (LB) in 1973-74.



**A HIGHLY DECORATED SEASON**

- The Blue Devils had six All-Americans in 2014 with **Jeremy Cash**, **Jamison Crowder**, **DeVon Edwards**, **Ross Martin**, **Will Monday** and **Laken Tomlinson**, tied for the third most in a year in program history and the most in a campaign since six in 1965.

**ALL-AMERICANS ON THE RISE**

- Duke has 11 student-athletes who have earned a total of 33 All-America honors in the seven years (2008-14) under head coach **David Cutcliffe**.
- In the previous seven years (2001-07), Duke had one All-America, **Mike Hart**, a *Football News* honorable mention selection at tight end in 2001.

**DUKE IN THE NFL**

- The Blue Devils had two 2015 NFL Draft selections in first rounder **Tomlinson** and fourth round pick **Crowder**.
- Tomlinson was the 28th overall selection, going to the Detroit Lions. He was the highest Duke pick since **Mike Junkin** went fifth overall to the Cleveland Browns in 1987.
- Crowder was selected by the Washington Redskins with the 105th overall pick.
- It marked the first time since 1982 that the Blue Devils had two top-five round picks in the same year, and just the sixth time in the 102-season history of the program.
- Duke has now had draft picks in three consecutive years for the first time since 1998-2000.
- The Blue Devils' four NFL Draft picks in a three-year span were the most for the program since having four from 1996-98.

**CUTCLIFFE IS REGION 1 COACH OF THE YEAR**

- Head coach **David Cutcliffe** was named the *American Football Coaches Association* (AFCA) FBS Region 1 Coach of the Year.
- It was the first time a Duke coach had received the AFCA region honor.

**CUTCLIFFE MOVING UP DUKE'S WINS CHART**

- With Duke's nine victories in 2014, **Cutcliffe** moved ahead of **Mike McGee** (1971-78/37) and into sole possession of third on the all-time Duke chart with 40 victories. **Wallace Wade** (1931-41; 1946-50) owns the school mark with 110 triumphs while **Bill Murray** (1951-65) is second with 93 wins.

**EIGHT ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK PICKS**

- Duke ended 2014 with six student-athletes receiving eight total ACC Player of the Week honors.
- Freshman RB **Shaun Wilson** (rookie/Sept. 15), redshirt senior LT **Takoby Cofield** (offensive lineman/Sept. 22), redshirt junior S **Jeremy Cash** (co-defensive back/Sept. 29; defensive back/Oct. 13), redshirt junior C **Matt Skura** (co-offensive lineman/Oct. 20), senior WR/PR **Crowder** (receiver/Nov. 3; specialist/Nov. 10) and redshirt sophomore KR/S **Edwards** (specialist/Nov. 3) received awards for Duke.
- Duke had 15 ACC honorees in the last 18 weeks the league presented awards, including two weeks when the Blue Devils were on a bye.

**SECOND MOST POINTS AT DUKE**

- Duke tallied 421 points in 2014, the second-highest single-season total in program history, behind only the 2013 squad's 459 points. The 2013 team also played one more game than the 2014 group.
- The top three single-season point totals have all come under **Cutcliffe's** direction.

**30.00+ FOR THREE STRAIGHT YEARS**

- Duke finished 2014 averaging 32.38 points per game. It marked the first time in program history averaging 30.00 or more points for three straight years.
- The Blue Devils averaged 30.00 points per game just five other times: 33.50/1943; 32.79/2013; 32.70/1941; 31.54/2012 and 30.00/1994.

**5,000 TOTAL YARDS IN THREE STRAIGHT YEARS**

- Duke reached 5,178 yards of total offense for the season, topping the 5,000-yard plateau for the third straight season, a first in program history.
- The only other consecutive 5,000-yard campaigns were in 1988-89.
- In 2005, Duke finished with a little more than half the offensive output of 2014, amassing 2,729 yards of total offense in 11 games. Duke reached 2,729 yards of total offense in the seventh game of 2014.

**BOONE WINNINGEST QB AT DUKE**

- Starting quarterback **Anthony Boone's** win at Syracuse on November 8 was his 18th as a starter, surpassing **Jerry Barger** (1951-54/17) for the most by a Duke signal caller in program history.
- Boone earned his 19th career victory in the regular season finale against Wake Forest.
- Boone finished his career with the second highest winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history at .760. He trailed only **Worth Lutz's** .846 mark. Boone had 25 career decisions to Lutz's 13.
- Only four Duke quarterbacks have a winning percentage of .700 or higher.

**QBS RUSHING INTO THE END ZONE**

- Redshirt sophomore QB **Thomas Sirk** ran for eight touchdowns in 2014, tied for the fourth most by a Duke quarterback in a season. **Brandon Connette** set the record in 2013 with 14.
- **Boone** added five rushing scores in 2014, tied for the ninth most by a Duke quarterback in a season.
- **Sirk** and **Boone** combined to score 13 of Duke's 24 rushing touchdowns (.542 percent).

**CROWDER TIES FOR THE TOP SPOT**

- **Crowder** finished his career with 283 receptions, tied with former Blue Devil **Conner Vernon** (2009-12/283) for the Duke and ACC career records.

**SECOND IN DUKE HISTORY IN YARDS**

- **Crowder** also owns the second most receiving yards in program history with 3,641.
- The total is good for third in ACC history, behind only **Vernon** (3,749) and Florida State's Rashad Greene (2011-14/3,830).

**1,000 FOR THREE SEASONS**

- **Crowder** ended the 2014 campaign with 1,044 receiving yards to join Duke's **Clarkston Hines** (1987-89) as the only ACC players with three 1,000-yard seasons.

**100 OR MORE, 16 TIMES**

- **Crowder** tallied 102 receiving yards against No. 15 Arizona State in the Hyundai Sun Bowl to give him 16 career 100-yard performances. The total is the second most in ACC and school history, behind only **Hines'** 17 such contests.

**RUNNING AT A PREMIUM RATE**

- Duke averaged 181.85 rushing yards per game in 2014, its highest average since gaining 198.64 yards per contest in 1977.
- The low average during the drought was 63.50 yards per game in 2009.
- Duke has relied on an increasing ground game in the last four years under **Cutcliffe**, nearly doubling the average from the 2011 squad (94.08 yards per game) in 2014.

**20 OR MORE TOUCHDOWNS ON THE GROUND**

- Duke rushed for 24 touchdowns in 2014 and had 28 ground scores the previous season.
- It is the first time since 1994-95 the Blue Devils had consecutive seasons with 20 or more rushing TDs.
- The 52 ground scores in the last two years are the third most in a two-season span in Duke history, behind only 55 from 1953-54 and 53 from 1954-55.
- From 2005-09, Duke had just 47 rushing touchdowns.
- In 2014, Duke had three players with five or more rushing touchdowns for just the fourth time in program history.

**THE FEWEST HITS ALLOWED BEHIND THE LINE**

- The offensive line surrendered 41.0 tackles for lost yardage in 2014, an average of 3.15 TFL per game. Both totals were the lowest in the nation.

**AMONG THE TOP 10 IN FEWEST SACKS**

- The Blue Devils allowed 13.0 sacks in 2014, tied for the 10th fewest allowed among FBS programs.
- Duke's 1.00 sacks per game was the nation's eighth-best mark while the Blue Devils led the ACC in fewest sacks allowed per passing attempt (36.23).
- The Blue Devils turned in four consecutive games without surrendering a sack and had yielded just 4.0 through the first nine contests of the season.

**MARTIN BECOMES CAREER SCORING LEADER**

- Kicker **Ross Martin** became Duke's career points leader in week four against Tulane, passing **Sims Lenhardt**, who amassed 240 points between 1996-99. Martin ended the year with 310 career points.
- Martin has 52 career field goals, trailing only **Lenhardt** (55) for the Duke record.
- Martin has converted a Duke-record 110 consecutive PATs.
- Martin owns 154 career extra points, the eighth most in ACC history.

**LITTLE ALLOWED ON PUNT RETURNS**

- Duke yielded just 33 punt return yards, or 2.54 yards a game and 2.06 yards per runback.
- In seven games, the Blue Devils did not allow a punt return yard. In two contests, foes had negative punt return yards.
- Duke's average of 2.06 yards allowed per return was the nation's third best.

**FEW POINTS PER GAME ALLOWED**

- The Blue Devils yielded 21.77 points a game, the fifth best mark since the start of the 1976 season and best since 20.58 points per game in 1994.
- Duke held seven opponents to under 20 points in 2014, its best year since keeping eight under 20 in 1974.

**13 OR FEWER POINTS OVERALL**

- Duke held Syracuse to 10 points on November 8, marking the fifth time during the campaign the Blue Devils held a foe to 13 or fewer points.
- In head coach **David Cutcliffe's** previous six seasons, the Blue Devils had just seven games keeping foes to 13 or fewer points.
- Duke had not held five opponents to 13 or fewer points in the same season since 1971, when it held six to 13 or fewer.

**FOURTH QUARTER LESS THAN A TD ALLOWED**

- In Duke's last 27 games, opponents have scored 121 fourth quarter points, an average of 4.48 per contest.

- In 2014, Duke shut out Troy, Kansas, Tulane, Virginia, Syracuse and Wake Forest in the fourth.

**AMONG THE TOP 25 IN OVERALL QB RATING**

- Duke limited opposing quarterbacks to a 115.19 rating, good for the 23rd best defensive mark in the country.

**100 OR MORE TACKLES FOR THREE**

- Linebacker **David Helton** (134), safety **DeVon Edwards** (133) and safety **Jeremy Cash** (111) each tallied 100 or more tackles in 2014.
- Duke and Wake Forest were the only teams in the ACC with multiple players over the 100-tackle mark.
- The Blue Devil trio of Helton, Edwards and Cash combined to record 36.1 percent of Duke's tackles.
- It was the eighth time in program history Duke had at least three players with 100 or more tackles (1976, 1980, 1986, 1990, 1996, 2007 and 2013).
- It was just the third time the Blue Devils had at least three players record 110 or more tackles, joining the 1976 and 2013 squads.
- Duke had one of four defensive trios nationally to post 100 or more tackles each, joining Cincinnati, Illinois and Wake Forest.
- **Cash** and **Helton** were the first Duke players with 100 or more stops in consecutive seasons since **Vincent Rey** and **Michael Tauilili** in 2007-08.

**HELTON RECEIVES CAMPBELL TROPHY**

- **Helton** became the first Duke student-athlete, and only the second in ACC history, to receive the

William V. Campbell Trophy, given to the nation's absolute best football student-athlete.

- He owned a 3.64 grade point average while majoring in psychology and minoring in theater studies.
- Helton was also a Capital One/CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American and received the ACC's Jim Tatum Award, given annually to the league's top senior football student-athlete.

**THREE IN A ROW FOR DUKE**

- **Helton's** NFF Scholar-Athlete Award and Tatum Award selection gave Duke three consecutive winners as **Sean Renfree** (2012) and **Perry Simmons** (2013) were honored the previous two years.

**HELTON THE LEADING ACC TACKLER**

- **Helton** topped the ACC with 10.42 tackles per game, leading the league for the second straight year.
- Helton is only the fifth player in league history to repeat as league tackle champion, and the first since current NFL Pro Bowler Luke Kuechly (Boston College) accomplished the feat from 2009-11.

**THE 100, 10.0, 5.0 CLUB**

- **Cash** was the only defensive back in the country to have tallied 100 or more tackles, 10.0 or more tackles for loss and 5.0 or more sacks in 2014.
- Cash was one of just 10 FBS defensive backs to have recorded 110 or more tackles last season.
- Cash is only the second Duke player with 100 or more stops in his first two years on the active roster, joining **Erwin Sampson** (1988-89).

- Duke won its season opener for the fifth time in seven years, including three straight, under head coach **David Cutcliffe**
- Duke's 52 points were the most in a season opener since totaling 52 versus Penn in 1954
- Redshirt senior quarterback **Anthony Boone** threw for 247 yards to lift his career total to 3,336 yards, moving him into 12th place on the Duke all-time list
- Boone tossed four touchdown passes to increase his career total to 23, moving him into a tie for ninth on Duke's career passing TD list with Leo Hart (1969-70) and Billy Ray (1989-90)
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Thomas Sirk** played in his first career game, scoring two rushing touchdowns in the fourth quarter and completing 5-of-7 passes for 40 yards
- Senior wide receiver **Jamison Crowder** hauled in seven passes for 93 yards and two touchdowns, becoming the ninth player in Atlantic Coast Conference history to tally 200 or more receptions
- Crowder extended his consecutive games streak with two or more receptions to 29, breaking the previous school record of 28 ... Crowder also recorded his 24th career game with five or more receptions
- Redshirt senior wide receiver **Issac Blakeney** caught two touchdown passes on the night, recording multiple receiving touchdowns for the second time in his career
- Junior kicker **Ross Martin** drilled a 49-yard field goal in the third quarter to give him 34 for his career, tying for the fifth most in Duke history
- Senior linebacker **David Helton** recorded his 26th career 5+ tackle game after posting five tackles while playing at the Mike slot due to the season-ending injury suffered by **Kelby Brown**

- Duke improved to 2-0 for the second-straight season, a first since 1987 and 1988
- Duke has won eight consecutive non-league regular season games and 11 of the last 12
- The Blue Devils outgained Troy, 452-396, in total yards of offense. Duke has outgained its foes in four of the last five contests, with the only exception being to eventual national champion Florida State in the 2013 Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game
- Redshirt senior quarterback **Anthony Boone** passed for 268 yards and one touchdown, while adding 47 yards on the ground and two rushing touchdowns on nine carries, matching a career high for rushing touchdowns in a game

## Game 3 • Duke 41, Kansas 3

- With the victory, Duke improved to 3-0 for the first time since opening the 1994 campaign at 7-0
- Duke's nine consecutive non-league regular season wins are the most in Duke history
- Through the first three contests, Duke has outscored opponents 72-23 in the first half of games
- Duke did not commit a turnover for the third straight game, a first for the program since Nov. 23, 2002, against North Carolina to Sept. 5, 2003, versus Western Carolina
- Freshman running back **Shaun Wilson** broke the Duke single-game rushing record with 245 yards on the ground ... Wilson's 245 yards are the third-most by an FBS running back in 2014 and the 27th-most in ACC history

- Duke WR **Jamison Crowder** caught seven passes to tie the ACC and Duke career reception records, reaching 283 total grabs
- **Crowder** threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR **Issac Blakeney** with 5:03 to play to give Duke a 31-30 advantage. It was Crowder's first pass of the season and gave the Blue Devils the lead after they had fallen behind by as much as 20-3
- **Crowder** tallied 102 receiving yards for his 16th career 100-yard performance, the second most in ACC and Duke history behind only Clarkston Hines' 17 100-yard games
