2015 DUKE FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

A THIRD STRAIGHT EIGHT-WIN SEASON

- With a 44-41 overtime victory against Indiana in the 2015 New Era Pinstripe Bowl, Duke earned its eighth win of the season.
- The victory marked the first time in Duke history the Blue Devils won eight or more games in three consecutive seasons.
- The Blue Devils own three consecutive winning seasons for the first time since 1960-63.

BOWLING FOUR STRAIGHT YEARS

- The Blue Devils played in a bowl game in four straight years for the first time in program history.
- Duke had never appeared in consecutive bowl games until the 2012-13 seasons.
- The New Era Pinstripe Bowl was Duke's 12th bowl appearance and fourth since the 1994 season.
- The 44-41 victory against Indiana was Duke's first in a bowl game since topping Arkansas 7-6 in the January 2, 1961, Cotton Bowl.
- Duke is 4-8 all-time in bowl appearances.
- The Blue Devils' all-time record in seasons following a bowl is 72-43-2 with winning records in all but the 1958 (5-5), 1990 (4-7) and 1995 (3-8) seasons.

AMONG THE WINNINGEST TWO YEARS AT DUKE

- The nine wins in 2014 and eight in 2015 have given the Blue Devils one of the winningest two-year stretches in program history. A closer look at the winningest consecutive seasons at Duke:

AND THE WINNINGEST THREE YEARS AT DUKE

- Duke won 10 games in 2013, nine in 2014 and eight in 2015 to give the Blue Devils the winningest three-year stretch in program history. A closer look at the winningest three consecutive seasons at Duke:

- Duke has tallied 33 wins the past four seasons. In the previous nine seasons, from 2003-11, Duke recorded 25 victories. A closer look:

DUKE CRACKS BOTH NATIONAL POLLS IN 2015

- Duke reached as high as No. 18 in the Amway Coaches Poll and No. 22 by the *Associated Press* heading into the October 31 contest against Miami.
- It was the highest spot for the Blue Devils in the Coaches Poll in program history.

DUKE RANKED AGAIN

- The Blue Devils played two or more games as a ranked team for three consecutive years for the first time since 1952-55. It was also the first time Duke played a home game as a ranked team in consecutive years since 1952-55.

DUKE DEFEATS ANOTHER RANKED FOE

- With a 34-20 victory against No. 20 Georgia Tech, Duke has recorded at least one win against a ranked opponent for three consecutive years, a first for the program since 1955-60.
- Duke's four total wins against ranked teams in the past three years (No. 16 Virginia Tech & No. 24 Miami in 2013; No. 22 Georgia Tech in 2014) are the most in a three-year stretch since four from 1958-60.
- Duke is 4-4 in its last eight games against ranked foes after losing 47 straight to ranked opponents (November 6, 1994 to October 25, 2013).

2015 SENIOR CLASS THE BEST AT DUKE

- With 33 victories in the last four years, the 2015 senior class tied for the winningest in Blue Devil history. A closer look at the winningest four-year senior classes at Duke:

THREE STRONG YEARS IN THE ACC

- Duke earned its fourth ACC win in the regular season finale at Wake Forest. It is the first time the Blue Devils have had three straight non-losing ACC seasons since 1981-83.
- The Blue Devils' past three years in the ACC have produced 15 wins, the third most in a three year span at Duke. A closer look:

ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL OCTOBER

- Duke has gone 8-1 in October the last three seasons with the lone loss during the stretch a 30-27 setback to Miami on October 31, 2015, when the Hurricanes scored on the final play of the game.
- Under head coach **David Cutcliffe**, Duke is 16-12 (.571) in October contests. Prior to Cutcliffe's arrival for the 2008 season, the Blue Devils were 1-29 (.033) in October in the previous eight seasons.

ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR & TATUM FOR CASH

- Redshirt senior safety **Jeremy Cash** was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Year and is the first Blue Devil to be named the recipient since the award was created in 1993.
- Cash was also selected as the Jim Tatum Award recipient as the ACC's top senior football scholar-athlete.
- He is the first student-athlete in ACC history to secure both the Tatum Award and a major on-field honor in the same season.

CASH'S ALL-AMERICA HONORS

- **Cash** received **Walter Camp Foundation** (WCF) All-America honors for the second consecutive year as he bumped up from the second team to the first team in 2015. He is the sixth first team **WCF** honoree at Duke.
- In all, Cash was named to the **American Football Coaches Association**, **Athlon Sports**, **Associated Press**, **CBS Sports**, **ESPN**, **Football Writers Association**, **Phil Steele**, **Sporting News**, **Sports Illustrated**, **USA Today** and **WCF** first teams.
- Cash became the Blue Devils' first player in program history to be named to a first, second or third team All-America squad in three consecutive years.
- Duke has had **WCF** and **AP** first team All-Americans in consecutive years for the first time in program history with **Cash** (2015) and **Laken Tomlinson** (2014).

CONSECUTIVE CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICANS

- **Cash** was named a consensus All-America honoree, and a unanimous first team All-America. In 2014, **Tomlinson** was a consensus All-America selection. It is the first time in program history Duke has had consecutive consensus All-America picks.
- Cash is the sixth consensus All-America in program history, joining **Fred Crawford** (1933), **Ace Parker** (1936), **Ernie Jackson** (1971), **Clarkston Hines** (1989) and **Tomlinson** (2014).

SKURA AN ALL-AMERICA HONOREE

- Redshirt senior center **Matt Skura** was a **USA Today** second team, **Phil Steele** fourth team and **Sports Illustrated** honorable mention All-America. They were Skura's first career All-America accolades.

TWO FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA PICKS

- The Blue Devils had a pair of Freshman All-America picks with linebacker **Tinashe Bere** and wide receiver **T.J. Rahming** earning honorable mention recognition from both **Campus Insiders** and **College Football News**.

ALL-AMERICANS ON THE RISE

- Duke has 12 All-America selections who have earned a total of 49 All-America honors in the eight years (2008-15) under **Cutcliffe**.
- In the previous eight years (2001-07), Duke had two All-Americans, **Mike Hart**, a **Football News** Honorable Mention selection at tight end in 2001, and punter **Brian Morton**, who was on three All-America teams in 2000.

THREE CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA PICKS

- Duke tied for the national lead with three CoSIDA Academic All-America picks and led all FBS schools with its trio of selections. Redshirt junior defensive tackle **A.J. Wolf** was a first team honoree while senior kicker **Ross Martin** and redshirt junior safety **DeVon Edwards** were second team selections.
- FCS programs Northern Iowa and South Dakota State had three CoSIDA Academic All-America selections. Among Power 5 programs, only Ohio State (two) and Kentucky (two) had multiple selections.

FIVE TABBED CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

- Duke led the country with five CoSIDA Academic All-District honorees. The Blue Devils have had 17 CoSIDA All-District picks in the last four seasons.
- Redshirt sophomore offensive tackle **Gabe Brandner**, **Martin**, redshirt junior quarterback **Thomas Sirk** and **Wolf** made their first appearances on the team while **Edwards** earned his second straight selection to the squad.

EIGHT ALL-ACC SELECTIONS

- Duke placed eight players on the 2015 Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSM) or ACC Coaches All-ACC football teams. A closer look at Duke's all-league selections:

FOUR TIME ALL-ACC SELECTIONS

- Kicker **Martin** and punter **Will Monday** ended their careers as four-time All-ACC selections. Martin and Monday are the first Duke players to earn four all-league accolades in their careers.

ACC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- Edwards** was named the November 23 ACC Specialist of the Week.
- Edwards' honor gave Duke seven ACC Players of the Week in 2015: **Sirk** (offensive back/Oct. 26), **Martin** (specialist/Oct. 5), **Jeremy Cash** (defensive back/Sept. 28), **Edwards** (specialist/Sept. 28), **Wolf** (defensive lineman/Sept. 28) and **Johnell Barnes** (receiver/Sept. 28).
- The Blue Devils have earned 22 ACC honors the last 27 weeks the team has played a game.

A NEUTRAL SITE VICTORY

- Duke captured the New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium for its first win at a neutral site since topping Navy 17-16 on Oct. 28, 1972, in Norfolk, Va. The Blue Devils were in an 0-9 slump.

QUITE A FOUR-YEAR RUN FOR DUKE

- Duke's last four years have been some of the best in program history. A closer look at some of the accomplishments for the Blue Devils since the beginning of the 2012 campaign:

MARTIN NAMED TO AP ALL-BOWL TEAM

- Following a 14-point performance in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl, **Martin** earned a spot on the *Associated Press* All-Bowl Team.
- Martin drilled the game-winning 36-yard field goal in the first overtime period as the Blue Devils topped Indiana 44-41. Martin helped force overtime by converting the game-tying extra point with 41 seconds remaining in regulation.
- Martin established the Duke bowl record with three total field goals, covering 52, 34 and 36 yards.

PINSTRIPE BOWL POINTS APLENTY

- Duke scored a New Era Pinstripe Bowl-record 44 points against Indiana in its 44-41 overtime victory against Indiana.
- Sophomore **Shaun Wilson** also set a Pinstripe Bowl record with his 98-yard kickoff return, besting the 51-yard runback by Rutgers' Janarion Grant in 2013 against Notre Dame.

THREE FOR 100+ AT THE PINSTRIPE BOWL

- For the second time in program history, and first in a bowl game, Duke had three 100-yard rushers in a contest as **Sirk** (155), **Jela Duncan** (109) and **Wilson** (103) all reached the century mark.
- Against Wake Forest in 1981, Mike Grayson (188), Joel Blunk (119) and Greg Boone (101) all reached the 100-yard plateau.

SIRK, WILSON NAMED BOWL CO-MVPs

- As a result of their strong performances and helping Duke to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl victory, **Sirk** and **Wilson** were named Co-MVPs of the contest.

400 OR MORE YARDS PER GAME

- Duke averaged 439.38 yards of total offense a contest, the third highest mark in program history and the most since 459.92 yards per game in 1989. The 1988 team owns the record with a 464.27 yards per game average.

MORE THAN 5,000 TOTAL YARDS AGAIN

- Duke totaled 5,712 yards of total offense in 13 games, reaching the 5,000-yard plateau for the fourth straight season, a first in program history. The only consecutive 5,000-yard campaigns were in 1988-89.
- The Blue Devils' 5,712 yards are the second most in program history, behind only 5,966 yards in 2013, when the team played 14 games.

30.00+ PPG FOR FOUR STRAIGHT YEARS

- The Blue Devils averaged 31.54 points per game, tied with the 2012 team for the fifth highest average in program history.
- It was the fourth straight year Duke has surpassed the 30.00 points per game average.
- Duke has averaged 30.00 or more points per game only eight times in program history, four under head coach **David Cutcliffe**.

20 OR MORE TOUCHDOWNS ON THE GROUND

- Duke tallied 25 rushing touchdowns in 2015, marking its third consecutive campaign of 20 or more rushing TDs for the first time since 1974-76.
- The 77 ground scores in the last three years are tied for the second most in a three-season span in Duke history, behind only 79 ground scores from 1953-55.

TWO WITH 5 OR MORE GROUND SCORES

- Sirk** finished with a team-high eight rushing touchdowns while redshirt sophomore quarterback **Parker Boehme** tallied five, marking the 24th season Duke has had two players with five or more ground scores.

50 OR MORE SIX TIMES

- Sirk** and **Wilson** both broke off rushes of 50 or more yards in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl.
- Wilson ran for an 85-yard score in the first quarter against Indiana to tie for the longest rush in program history. Charlie Smith also had an 85-yard run against Virginia Tech in 1951.
- The Blue Devils recorded six rushes, all against Power 5 foes, of more than 50 yards in 2015, the most in the **Cutcliffe** era.
- Duke's six 50+ yard rushes were tied for the 10th most in the country.
- Entering 2015, Duke had totaled seven rushes of 50 or more yards in the last five seasons combined.

MARTIN'S RECORD-SETTING CAREER ENDS

- Martin** ended his Duke career holding almost every single-season and career record for a kicker. He departs the Blue Devils owning records for:
 - Single-season field goals made - 26 (2015)
 - Single-season field goals attempted - 30 (2015)
 - Single-season points - 120 (2015)
 - Single-season 50+ yard field goals - 4 (2015)
 - Career field goals made - 78
 - Career field goals attempted - 93
 - Career field goal percentage - .839
 - Career 50+ yard field goals - 8
 - Career PATs made - 196
 - Career consecutive PATs made - 152
 - Career points - 430

WITHIN THE TOP TWO IN ACC HISTORY

- **Ross Martin** ended his career as the third 400-point scorer in league history, all done within the last three years. Martin finished with 430 points, second only to Dustin Hopkins of Florida State (2009-12/466 points).

MONDAY ENDS AS DUKE'S BEST PUNTER

- Redshirt senior punter **Will Monday** became the 10th punter in ACC history to reach 10,000 career yards in 2015. He ended his career owning the Duke record for career punting average (42.64) and holds the second most yards with 11,299.

MR. NOVEMBER STRIKES AGAIN

- Redshirt junior **DeVon Edwards** ran a kickoff back 94 yards for a touchdown at Virginia.
- The runback was his third of the year, establishing the Duke single-season TD record. Edwards ran a kickoff back 95 yards at Tulane in the season opener and 100 yards against No. 20 Georgia Tech.
- The trio of kickoff return touchdowns in 2015 gave Edwards six in his career. The NCAA career record is seven kickoff return touchdowns, held by C.J. Spiller of Clemson.
- Edwards' six kickoff returns for touchdowns are also tied with UTEP's Autry Golden for the most by an active FBS player.
- Of Edwards' six career kickoff return touchdowns, four have been in November.

HUMPHREYS HONORS BROWN IN BOWL GAME

- True freshman **Ben Humphreys** made his second career start against Indiana in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl and honored injured redshirt senior **Kelby Brown** by wearing Brown's No. 59 jersey.
- Brown, who had his career ended by a knee injury in preseason camp, was slated to be a starter at linebacker after missing the 2014 campaign due to a knee injury. Brown was an All-ACC performer in 2013.

BERE IN THE BACKFIELD IN CHARLOTTESVILLE

- Redshirt freshman **Tinashe Bere** posted a career-high 3.0 tackles for lost yards at Virginia.
- Bere's 3.0 TFL are tied for the second most by a freshman in a game in program history, behind only 4.0 by **Todd DeLamielleure** versus Wake Forest in 1998.

BORDERS LEADS THE WAY IN INTs AGAIN

- Junior cornerback **Breon Borders** led Duke with three interceptions and nine pass breakups during the 2015 season.
- Borders will enter 2016 tied for fifth among NCAA active players with 10 career picks.
- On the all-time Duke chart, Borders is tied for seventh with 10 all-time interceptions and alone in 10th with 23 career pass breakups.

100 OR MORE TACKLES FOR THREE

- Linebacker **Dwayne Norman** (114), safety **DeVon Edwards** (101) and safety **Jeremy Cash** (101) each tallied 100 or more tackles in 2015.
- Duke was the only team in the ACC with three players over the 100-tackle mark.
- It was the ninth time in program history, and third consecutive campaign, Duke had at least three players with 100 or more tackles (1976, 1980, 1986, 1990, 1996, 2007, 2013 and 2014).
- Duke had one of two defensive trios nationally to post 100 or more tackles each, joining Tulsa.
- Edwards has reached the 100-tackle mark the last two years and could become just the eighth player in Duke history to have three seasons with 100+ tackles.

COMMUNITY IMPACT UNDER CUTCLIFFE

- Duke has had six selections (**Kelby Brown**/2015; **Laken Tomlinson**/2014; **Dave Harding**/2013; **Sean Renfree**/2012; **Bryan Morgan**/2010; **Re'quan Boyette**/2008) to the AFCA Good Works Team since **Cutcliffe's** arrival in 2008. No other ACC program has more than three during the stretch. Miami has the second most with three while Clemson, Florida State, N.C. State, Pitt and Syracuse each have one.

A PAIR OF OVERTIME VICTORIES

- For the first time in program history, the Blue Devils won two overtime contests in the same season (45-43 at Virginia Tech/44-41 vs. Indiana).

- The Blue Devils assured themselves of three straight winning seasons for the first time since 1960-63
- Duke reached the 4-4 mark in the ACC and has won four or more league games for three straight years, a feat not accomplished by the program since 1960-63
- The Blue Devils won 13 of their last 16 road games dating back to the start of the 2013 season. Duke's 13 wins on the road since 2013 are the most in the ACC and the second most among Power 5 programs
- Redshirt junior quarterback **Thomas Sirk** rushed for 57 yards, lifting his season total to 650, the second most by a Duke quarterback in a year in program history
