In 2009, Duke University and Nike Inc. reached a 10-year sponsorship agreement that will supply all 26 of the Blue Devils' athletics teams with uniforms, footwear, apparel and equipment.

Under the terms of the contract, Nike will phase in its exclusive agreement with all Duke Athletics teams over a three-year period beginning in 2008-09.

Additionally, all officially licensed Blue Devils merchandise sold by Nike will comply with labor policies consistent with Duke's position on worker's rights. Duke has long been a leader in demanding manufacturers of licensed products protect the rights of workers.

In 1997, Duke was the first university in the country to adopt a code of conduct for apparel manufacturers requires licensees, their contractors and sub-contractors to accept independent monitoring of factory working conditions. Two years later, Duke established another standard by requiring its licensees to publicly disclose the names and locations of factories that manufacture Duke items. Duke remains very involved in these issues and committed to ensuring that products bearing its name and/or trademarks are manufactured under decent and humane working conditions.

Nike will provide cash compensation annually to the Duke Department of Athletics over the term of the contract.

Nike will provide annual funding to local charities of Duke's choice.

Each year, one Duke student-athlete will receive a paid internship at Nike headquarters near Beaverton, Ore., beginning in the summer of 2009.

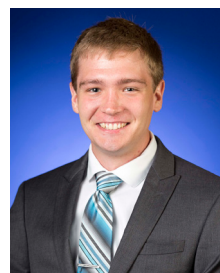

2015-16 SEASON OUTLOOK

Strong Intentions for 2016 Campaign

The Duke women's tennis team enters the 2015-16 season following a 17-10 mark over the course of the 2015 spring campaign. The Blue Devils reached the NCAA Tournament, playing into the second round of the competition. Duke once again faced stout competition last year, earning 10 wins against nationally ranked competition and posting an eight-match win streak that ran from Feb. 27 through March 28.

Experienced Core

Although the Blue Devils lose a trio of upperclassmen in Ester Goldfeld, Annie Mulholland and Rachel Kahan, Duke returns six student-athletes that competed in 51.6% of the team's overall singles competitions last season. Sophomore Samantha Harris returns to Durham following a successful rookie season. In addition to earning Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Carolina Region Rookie of the Year honors, Harris also garnered a spot on the All-ACC third team. Harris became just the sixth Blue Devil in program history to reach double-digit conference victories (10) in singles contests and saw the second most singles victories of any member of the team during the 2014-15 campaign with 24. Beatrice Capra also enters her final year at Duke, competing in 20 overall singles matches last season following recovery from knee surgery. Capra posted a 12-8 record, including an 11-7 record against ACC opponents while competing at the No. 1 position. She received All-ACC first team recognition for her efforts.

Top Incoming Talent

The Blue Devils welcomed the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation (according to TennisRecruiting.net) this fall as Ellyse Hamlin, Jessica Ho and Kaitlyn McCarthy arrived in Durham ahead of the 2015-16 campaign. Each individual in the trio owns a wealth of experience and success, with Hamlin and McCarthy each earning spots on the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) preseason doubles poll. Hamlin, while paired with senior Beatrice Capra, garnered the No. 39 spot, while sophomore Samantha Harris and McCarthy appear at No. 42. Hamlin and McCarthy also secured spots on the Oracle/ITA Division I Women's National Newcomer/Freshmen Rankings list, appearing at No. 6 and No. 9, respectively.

Updated Scoring System

In an effort to make the college game of tennis safer and more fan friendly, a new scoring system will be put into place for the upcoming 2016 season. On Aug. 13, the Division I Competition Oversight Committee approved no-ad scoring for all men's and women's tennis competitions, removing the advantage-scoring system which was originally in place when a game score reached 40-40. In addition, doubles matches, previously played to eight games, will now be played to six games. Warm ups between opponents prior to singles play has also been removed in an effort to accelerate the rate of a match. The Blue Devils experimented with no-ad scoring prior to the start of conference play last season, utilizing the system during the ITA Kick-Off Weekend and the ITA Women's Team Indoor Championship.

Duke in the NCAA Tournament

The Blue Devils reached the NCAA Team Championships for the 27th time in program history, playing into the second round of the 2015 tournament. Duke improved to 61-26 (.701) all-time in NCAA Team Championship matches. The Blue Devils own the fifth-best win percentage in tournament history, behind only Stanford (.883), Florida (.795), Georgia (.733) and UCLA (.729), while their 61 NCAA Team Championships victories rank seventh and trail only Stanford (136), Florida (105), UCLA (86), Georgia (74), Southern California (69) and California (65).

Under Ashworth's guidance, the Duke women's tennis team has reached the NCAA Tournament in all 19 seasons of his tenure, while collecting an overall record of 48-17 during that span.

Home is Where the Heart Is

Duke looks to continue its strong play at home in 2016, after dropping just two contests in Durham last season. Over the last five seasons, the Blue Devils own an impressive record of 53-6 (.898) while competing at home. During the 2015 campaign, Duke downed six ranked opponents in Ambler Stadium and Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center, including a victory over top-10 opponent Virginia.

Stout Competition in 2016

Duke will face a slew of tough opponents during the 2016 campaign, with 14 of the team's 21 opponents ranked by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) in the final poll of the 2015 season. Duke, which concluded the 2015 season ranked No. 19, rounds out the top five of ACC team's ranked, with No. 4 North Carolina, No. 9 Virginia, No. 15 Miami and No. 18 Clemson taking the other four spots. Georgia Tech appears at No. 20 on the list, giving the ACC six teams among the top-20 ranked programs in the country. In 2015, Duke posted an impressive record of 11-3 against conference foes, marking the second consecutive season the Blue Devils won double-digit matches against ACC competition.

In addition to ACC competition, the Blue Devils are scheduled to face opposition from five different athletic conferences, including the Colonial Athletic Association (Elon), the West Coast Conference (No. 63 University of Portland), the Southeastern Conference (No. 32 Mississippi State), the Big Ten (No. 26 Northwestern) and the Big 12 (No. 37 Texas). Overall, Duke owns a record of 397-149 (.727) against non-conference opponents, and has combined to go 141-105 (.573) against the five conferences the Blue Devils will face during the 2016 season.

Makarova's Return

Christina Makarova, the No. 1 recruit (according to TennisRecruiting.net) in 2014, looks to make an impact on the Duke lineup after missing a majority of the 2015 campaign while recovering from surgery. Makarova took the singles court for three matches during the 2014 fall season, compiling a 2-1 mark. Makarova also entered two doubles contests, splitting the matches, 1-1. Makarova dropped her contest while playing alongside recent graduate Annie Mulholland and earned a win when partnered with Alyssa Smith.

Stellar Freshman Season

Samantha Harris posted a strong freshman campaign that saw the Melbourne, Australia, native record an overall singles ledger of 24-8 and a doubles mark of 24-11. Harris became just the sixth freshman in Duke history to earn double-digit conference wins in singles play, compiling a mark of 10-4. Harris defeated a number of nationally ranked opponents over the course of the season, including victories over 25th-ranked Stephanie Nauta of Virginia, 63rd-ranked Clementina Riobueno of Miami and 104th-ranked Caroline Daxhelet of Virginia Tech. For her efforts, Harris was crowned the ITA Carolina Region Rookie of the Year. In addition to the regional award, Harris also garnered third team All-ACC honors, while reaching as high as 51st on the ITA's national singles polls.

Capra's Final Season at Duke

Senior Beatrice Capra, who prepares for her final season as a Blue Devil, sits just 26 singles wins shy of becoming the 25th singles player in Duke history to reach 100 wins for her career. The Ellicott City, Md., native has posted an impressive career while in Durham, most recently earning first team All-ACC honors and garnering the Inaugural Charles Hamilton Hargrave Award, presented to the team's most valuable player for the 2015 season.

Capra has seen an extremely successful career at Duke, twice earning All-America honors, while also being named the ACC Player of the Year in 2012 and the ITA National Rookie of the Year the same season.

Ambler Tennis Stadium and Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center

Over the past decade, Duke University has invested more than \$25 million to make its athletic facilities among the finest in the nation. This commitment is evident in the changes instituted directly for the Blue Devil tennis teams. Duke Athletic Director Kevin White continues to lead the way in providing Duke with top facilities to help student-athletes stay in peak condition.

Originally completed in the summer of 1987, the Duke Tennis Stadium was renovated into the Ambler Tennis Stadium. The facility was funded by Merrill Ambler and features seat-backs for fan seating, a scoreboard, new court surfaces and restrooms.

In addition to the fine outdoor courts, the Duke athletic department completed the Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center in the winter of 2000. Named after Karl and Alice Sheffield, the facility features six courts, offices for the coaches, a hall of fame room and locker rooms. It was awarded the 2000 United States Tennis Association Outstanding Tennis Facility on Feb. 25, 2001. The Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center is only the third tennis center in North Carolina to receive the award since it began in 1981.

The modern training room provides all of the equipment and services necessary to keep the Duke men's and women's tennis teams healthy and in action. The trainer's office is off the main training area, allowing the players convenient access to this care.

The weight room is another extensive area, directed by strength coordinator Dan Perlmutter. The 3,300 square-foot weight room has over three tons of free weights along with Nautilus, Hydra-Gym and Universal stations.

In 2008 the completion of the Michael W. Krzyzewski Center - Dedicated to Academic & Athletic Excellence - provided all of Duke's student-athletes with a new academics center featuring tutorial rooms, dedicated study space, computer lab areas and offices for academics staff, nearly tripling the size of the previous academics area.

Some more recent additions to the tennis facilities include a new state of the art Daktronics indoor scoring system. This project, which was installed in the fall of 2006, includes seven wireless scoreboards. There are six individual scoreboards (one mounted behind each court) that provides the player's name as well as the game and set scores. The main scoreboard shows the dual match score and scores of all six courts. Also the six main outdoor courts have been resurfaced in the US Open (Duke) blue color.



General Information

- There is no charge for tennis matches. All indoor matches occur in the Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center. All outdoor tennis matches occur in the Ambler Tennis Stadium.
- The entrance to the Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center is located between the Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center and the Ambler Tennis Stadium.
- The handicap entrance to the Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center is located on the south side of the Sheffield Indoor Tennis Center
- The entrance to the Ambler Tennis Stadium is located behind the bleachers of the stadium via the stairwells
- Handicap seating is located on the south side of the courts closest to Krzyzewskiville.
- Restrooms in the Sheffield Tennis Center are located on court level under the bleachers.
- Restrooms in the Ambler Tennis Stadium are located underneath the bleachers between the two stairwells.

One of the winningest women's tennis coaches in the nation, Jamie Ashworth has led the Blue Devils to new heights. Since becoming the head coach in 1997, he has led the program to 14 20-win seasons and 19 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. Under his guidance in 2009, the Blue Devils reached the pinnacle of success as they captured the program's first NCAA Championship. Over the past 19 years at the helm of the program, he has led Duke to a 427-108 (.798) overall record and a 151-34 (.816) ACC mark, while advancing to the NCAA Semifinals eight times, NCAA Championship match twice and notching ACC Tournament Championships on eight occasions.

Following the 2014 NCAA Team Championships, Ashworth was named the Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year, as voted on by his peers. He is also a two-time ACC Coach of the Year (2001 & 2003) recipient and five-time ITA Regional Coach of the Year (2000, 2003, 2008, 2011 & 2014).

The 2015 campaign saw Ashworth once again guide the Blue Devils to the NCAA Tennis Championships tournament, where the team played into the second round of the event. Overall, Duke earned a record of 17-10, the 19th straight season the Blue Devils compiled a winning record under Ashworth's guidance. In addition, Duke amassed a conference mark of 11-3, the fifth time in seven years the Blue Devils earned double-digit victories against ACC foes. The Ashworth-led Blue Devils also earned a berth into the ITA National Team Indoor Championships earlier in the year after opening the dual match season with back-to-back wins during the ITA Kickoff Weekend in Durham, N.C.

Multiple Blue Devils saw success individually as well in 2015, with Duke placing three players on the All-ACC team, including four-time honoree, Ester Goldfeld. Three Blue Devils also remained stalwart representatives among the nationally ranked singles players in the country, with all three concluding the year within the top 100. Two doubles pairs also finished the season among the top 60 ranked pairs in the nation. Under Ashworth's tutelage, freshman Samantha Harris earned ITA Carolina Region Rookie of the Year honors. Ashworth's continued emphasis on academics was also made evident by three Blue Devils earning spots on the All-ACC academic team.

In 2014, Ashworth once again led the Blue Devils to the NCAA Tennis Championships tournament, marking the team's 18th consecutive trip to the national tournament during his tenure. Duke reached the quarterfinal round for the 12th time with Ashworth as head coach. The Blue Devils bounced back from an injury plagued 2012-13 season by posting a 27-5 overall record and an 11-3 conference mark. Duke opened 2014 with eight consecutive wins, four of which came during the ITA National Team Indoor Championships, where the Blue Devils earned the second ITA National Team Indoor Championship title in program history in a hard-fought contest against No. 5 UCLA. Although Duke was recognized nationally throughout the year, the Blue Devils jumped to No. 1 following their showing in the tournament, a ranking the team held for five consecutive weeks from March 18 through April 15.

Individually, three singles players ranked among the top 35 in the nation at the conclusion of the season, and four doubles pairs appeared in the top-80 of the nationally ranked doubles teams. Three All-America honors were also earned by members of the Duke team, in addition to three All-ACC accolades in 2014. With Ashworth's assistance Hanna Mar earned the ITA Carolina Region Senior Player of the Year award following a stellar senior campaign. In addition, Mar received the Most Outstanding Player honor at the conclusion of the ITA National Team Indoor Championship, during which she remained undefeated and clinched Duke's team title by securing the final singles point in a hotly-contested match against UCLA.

The 2013 season marked Duke's 17th consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament with Ashworth at the helm, as the Blue Devils reached the round of 16 for the sixth time in as many years. Ashworth guided an injury-plagued Blue Devils squad to a 16-10 overall record and 5-5 ACC ledger. The Blue Devils closed the season with a 14th-place ranking on the ITA list. In addition to the team ranking, the Blue Devils also posted four singles players and four doubles pairs on the list. Three members of the Blue Devil squad garnered All-ACC honors,

the 31st, 32nd and 33rd players to earn such an honor during Ashworth's tenure.

In 2012, Ashworth led Duke to a 29-3 (.906) record overall to become the ACC's all-time wins leader. Duke finished 11-0 in the ACC to become the first team in ACC history to have a perfect 11-0 record and win the ACC tournament in the same season. The team's 29 wins tied the 2009 national championship team for the second most in a season, while the Blue Devils also tied the 2009 team for the second-longest winning streak in program history with 18 straight victories. The 2012 campaign was the fifth straight 20-win season for the program, and the eighth time that the Blue Devils reached the 25-win plateau during Ashworth's tenure. The Blue Devils reached the NCAA semifinals for the eighth time in program history, and finished the season listed No. 3 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's final team rankings for the second consecutive year. The Blue Devils ended the season with six players ranked in the final ITA poll, four players named to the All-ACC team, and freshman Beatrice Capra honored as ACC Player of the Year.

The 2011 season saw Ashworth lead the program to its third straight quarterfinal appearance and the 16th overall in the NCAA Championships. The Blue Devils finished the season ranked No. 3, and had all six singles players and four teams of doubles in the final ITA rankings. Nadine Fahoum, Rachel Kahan, Ellah Nze and Reka Zsilinszka were All-ACC selections. Kahan was named ACC Freshman of the Year, while Nze and Zsilinszka each concluded their college careers with four consecutive All-ACC honors.

In 2010, Ashworth reached another milestone in his career as he garnered his 300th career victory when the Blue Devils blanked ACC foe NC State 7-0 on Feb. 25, 2010. Duke posted a 22-8 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals. Duke also landed four players on the All-ACC Academic team.

Under Ashworth's guidance in 2009, Duke posted 29-3 overall record and finished the year on an 18-match win streak after blanking California 4-0 in the national title match. Both numbers rank second all-time in Duke tennis history.

Just a week after capturing the team title, Ashworth helped mentor Blue Devil freshman Mallory Cecil to the NCAA Individual Singles Championship and a No. 1 national ranking. Under his watch, Cecil, Ellah Nze and Reka Zsilinszka all captured All-America honors for singles, while Cecil was named the ITA Player of the Year. Duke was equally impressive in the classroom in 2008-09, landing an ACC-best five players on the All-ACC Academic team.

In addition to the NCAA title, the Blue Devils captured a share of the ACC regular season title and won the ACC Tournament Championship in thrilling fashion. Five Blue Devils earned at-large bids to the NCAA Tournament and seven players were ranked in the final ITA national poll.

In 2007-08, Ashworth helped put Duke back in the forefront of the nation's best teams, leading the Blue Devils to a 20-5 overall record and a runner-up finish in the ACC. Ranked ninth in the final national poll, Duke reached the NCAA Tournament for the 19th straight year and the 20th time overall. The Blue Devils advanced to the round of 16 as a team and had three individuals capture All-America honors after earning spots in the individuals tournament round of 16.

The 2006-07 campaign saw Duke go 12-10 (5-6 ACC) and reach the NCAA Tournament for the 18th straight year and 19th time overall. The Blue Devils finished the season with a national ranking of No. 21, led by sophomore Melissa Mang, who received All-ACC recognition for the second straight year, and freshman Amanda Granson, who led the squad in singles wins (23), dual match victories (15) and ACC triumphs (eight).

In 2005-06, Ashworth rounded out a decade as the head coach of the women's tennis program. His 10th year saw the Blue Devils go 20-8 overall and 9-1 in ACC play. Mang became the sixth Blue Devil freshman overall and third under Ashworth (Ansley Cargill, 2001; Kelly McCain, 2002) to receive ACC Rookie of the Year honors, as she also received All-ACC accolades along with Bercek and Jackie Carleton. Bercek and Carleton each received bids to the NCAA Singles Championships and Bercek garnered her third career All-America nod.

The Blue Devils ended the campaign ranked ninth in the country.

After serving as a Duke assistant coach from 1994-95 through 1996-97, Ashworth took over the head coaching reigns on March 20, 1997, and paced Duke to a 12-1 overall record and a 4-0 conference mark to wrap up the season.

In his first full year as a head coach (1997-98), Ashworth led Duke to 27 wins, then a school record, the school's 11th consecutive ACC regular season and tournament titles, Duke's best final national ranking at No. 2, its third consecutive Final Four and the program's first appearance in the NCAA title match.

The 1998-99 season was no letdown as he guided Duke to 27 wins, its 12th consecutive ACC regular season and tournament titles, its fourth straight NCAA semifinal appearance and a final No. 3 national ranking.

In 1999-2000, Ashworth guided a young Blue Devil team to a 23-6 record, a 13th consecutive ACC Tournament title and a Sweet 16 NCAA finish. The following campaign (2000-01) saw Ashworth lead the Blue Devils to 27 victories and an Elite Eight NCAA finish, along with Duke's 14th consecutive ACC Championship and an undefeated 8-0 ACC regular season mark.

In 2001-02, Duke posted a 25-5 overall record and won the ACC regular season title with an 8-0 mark. In 2002-03, Ashworth led the Blue Devils back to the NCAA Final Four, tied an ACC record with 30 victories, won the ACC regular season and tournament titles, and claimed the National Team Indoor Championship. With one of his youngest teams in his coaching history, Ashworth led Duke to the Elite Eight and a 22-5 mark in 2003-04.

During Ashworth's term as the assistant coach, the Blue Devils recorded a 59-13 overall record and a perfect 20-0 ACC mark. In his first year as an assistant in 1994-95, Duke went 22-6, advanced to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals and finished the year ranked No. 7. In 1995-96, he helped pace Duke to a 25-4 mark (then a school record for wins in a season), a trip to the NCAA Final Four and a national ranking of No. 3. In 1996-97, Duke advanced to its second straight NCAA Final Four, finishing the year third in the nation, once again.

Ashworth has coached 34 different All-ACC selections and 26 different All-America honorees, two national champions and four collegiate grand slam champions during his stint with the Blue Devils. That list that includes four-time All-America and 1998 NCAA singles national champion, Vanessa Webb, who is Duke tennis' only Honda Award winner and Olympian.

A 1994 speech communication graduate of Maryland, Ashworth was a four-year letterwinner for the Terrapins and served as a captain of the team his junior and senior years. He recently served on the ITA Board of Directors for the fifth year and just finished his sixth year on the Division I Women's Tennis Operating Committee.

A native of Amherst, N.H., Ashworth resides with his wife Caylan, his son Bryce and his daughter Molly in Durham.

Marc Spicijaric joined the Blue Devil coaching staff as an assistant coach in August of 2009. Spicijaric came to Durham after a standout career at the University of Illinois.

Among other duties, Spicijaric assists Ashworth in team training and recruiting for the Blue Devil tennis program. Duke's 2011 and 2015 recruiting classes ranked first and second in the nation, respectively, with the 2011 class including freshmen Beatrice Capra, Ester Goldfeld, Monica Turewicz and Annie Mulholland. The 2015 class welcomed Ellyse Hamlin, Jessica Ho and Kaitlyn McCarthy. His hard work paid off in 2012 as Capra was named ACC Player of the Year, and Capra, Goldfeld and Turewicz were all ranked in the final Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) poll.

Spicijaric's sixth season in Durham saw the Blue Devils earn double-digit conference victories for the fifth time in seven years as Duke compiled an 11-3 mark against ACC foes. Spicijaric also helped guide Duke to its 27th NCAA Tennis Championship tournament appearance, while also assisting freshman Samantha Harris to ITA Carolina Region Rookie of the Year honors.

In 2014, Spicijaric once again assisted with the success of the Duke women's tennis program, as the Blue Devils participated in the NCAA Team Championship tournament for the 18th consecutive season. Duke also claimed the ITA Indoor Team Championship title in exciting fashion as the Blue Devils outlasted UCLA, 4-3, in the final and amassed 20 or more wins in a season for the fourth time in his five year stint. Individually, members of the team thrived, as the Blue Devils boasted three All-Americans, three All-ACC honorees, three ITA Scholar Athletes, one All-ACC academic recipient, a Regional ITA Senior Player of the Year and a two-time ACC Player of the Week.

During his fourth year with the Duke women's tennis program, Spicijaric assisted Ashworth in leading an injury-plagued Blue Devil roster to a 16-10 season and Duke's 17th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Three members of Duke's tennis team earned All-ACC honors in 2013.

In 2012, Spicijaric assisted the team to a 29-3 (.906) record overall and an 11-0 mark in the ACC to become the first team in ACC history to have a perfect 11-0 record and win the ACC tournament in the same season. Since Spicijaric joined the staff in 2009, the Blue Devils have had three consecutive 20-win seasons.

The 2010-11 season saw Spicijaric help guide Duke to its second 25-win season in three years. His recruiting efforts paid great dividends as freshman Rachel Kahan went 31-1 in singles play on the way to earning ACC Rookie of the Year honors.

In his first season, Spicijaric helped lead the Blue Devils to a 22-8 overall record and a final national ranking of ninth. Three players captured All-ACC honors, while Ellah Nze earned All-American recognition.

Spicijaric had a stellar four-year career with Illinois, helping the Illini to four NCAA Tournament appearances, including advancing to the national title match in 2007. He closed out his career with a 90-55 singles record, a 96-48 doubles mark and earned All-Big Ten honors as a senior.

A native of Wesley Chapel, Fla., Spicijaric played primarily in the No. 1 spot as a senior, posting a 19-5 overall singles record and a 25-9 doubles record. Ranked as high as No. 50 in 2009, he finished the year ranked 74th nationally and 13th in the Midwest region. He also was voted as Illinois' Most Valuable Player by his teammates.

Known as "Mr. Clutch" during the 2006-07 season, Spicijaric tied for the most wins on the team with a 32-17 overall record in singles action. He proved to be pivotal in leading the Illini to the national finals, losing just one match in the NCAA Tournament and scored the match-clinching win over Ohio State in the national quarterfinals.

In his junior season, Spicijaric concluded the year with a 14-14 singles record and 5-4 ledger in Big Ten matches primarily in the No. 3 slot. He boasted a five-match win streak in the heart of the Big Ten season and compiled a 16-11 doubles record to finish ranked 42nd by the ITA.

Michelle Dasso joined the Blue Devil coaching staff as a volunteer assistant coach in October of 2015. Dasso joins the coaching staff following a nine-year head coaching career at Illinois, as well as a stellar playing career at Notre Dame and a three-year assistant coaching career at her alma mater.

Dasso owns a wealth of coaching experience from her time with Illinois. In addition to coaching the doubles tandem of Melissa Kopinski and Rachael White to All-America honors in 2013, she also helped lead the team to a No. 18 ranking during the 2012 campaign. Dasso, a native of Long Grove, Ill., brought some of the top talent to Illinois during her tenure, as the team's 2010 recruiting class ranked No. 4 in the nation and the 2015 recruiting class ranked 11th in the country. Dasso served on the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Division I Operating Board from 2010-2015 while coaching at Illinois, as well.

Prior to her head coaching career, Dasso served as an assistant women's tennis coach at her alma mater, Notre Dame, from 2003-2006. In 2006, Dasso's efforts were recognized by the ITA, as she garnered the National Assistant Coach of the Year award.

During her playing career at Notre Dame, Dasso saw one of the most successful careers in program history. Upon graduation in 2001, Dasso was the only four-time All-America recipient in the history of Notre Dame women's tennis. In her final season with the Fighting Irish, Dasso was named the ITA National Senior Player of the Year and concluded her career as the school record holder in career singles wins (140), career doubles wins (109) and season singles victories (40).

Tara Moore joined the Duke University Athletic Training staff in February of 2015. A native of Portland, Maine, Moore graduated from the University of Southern Maine in 2013 with a bachelor's of science degree in athletic training. She was also a member of the women's soccer program at Southern Maine. Moore also served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at the University of Alabama prior to arriving in Durham.

Former ACC champion and All-American Jeff Howser is in his 13th season as Duke's speed and conditioning coach.

A graduate of Duke, Howser was a six-time ACC champion and was named as one of the ACC's top-50 track athletes of all-time in 2003. He went on to earn a bronze medal at the World Championships in the 110-meter high hurdles and was an alternate on the U.S. Olympic Team. Howser ran on the international level for 14 years, was a four-time U.S. Olympic Trials qualifier and two-time U.S. Olympic Trials finalist.

He served previously as the sprints and hurdles coach at the University of Florida, UCLA, NC State, Duke and the University of North Carolina.

Howser also has coached a number of top world-ranked professional track athletes such as Anwar Moore (13.00-110m hurdles), Jason Smoots (6.51-60m, 10.01-100m), Bershawn Jackson (47.30-400m hurdles), Leonard Byrd (44.45-400m), Michelle Collins (50.00-400m, 22.18-200m indoor), Daniel Caines UK (44.98-400m), Crystal Cox (50.34-400m, 22.34-200m), Jordan Vaden (19.98-200m), Marion Jones (7.08-60m, 10.91-100m), and other athletes from Jamaica, Great Britain, Trinidad, Ghana, Bermuda and the Bahamas. He also has served as a consultant in training program design for several other top-ranked track athletes from various countries which include LaShawn Merritt, Tyson Gay and Veronica Campbell-Brown. Howser also assists Athens 2004 Head Olympic Coach George Williams in coaching the Nike GW Elite Track Club. His coaching resume includes thirteen Olympians, five Olympic Gold Medalists, four World Championship Gold Medalists and one World Cup Gold Medalist. In addition, one of Howser's athletes ran the fastest high school electronic 40-yard dash ever recorded (4.25 electronic at the Nike SPARQ Combine), which is also the second-fastest time in history.

He holds certifications from the National Strength and Conditioning Association, the USA Weightlifting Association, is the North Carolina director for the National Association of Speed and Explosion and is a USA Track and Field Elite Athlete Coach.

In addition to his duties as overall head strength coach for women's lacrosse, field hockey and the men's distance program, Howser designs and implements the speed, agility and conditioning programs for men's lacrosse, women's soccer, women's tennis and volleyball.

Kevin M. White was named Duke University's vice president and director of athletics on May 31, 2008. He also serves as an adjunct professor of business administration at the university.

White, 62, joined the Duke family after leading Notre Dame's athletics program to success both on the playing fields and in the classroom from 2000-08. He also has held a number of prominent national leadership roles within intercollegiate athletics, including his service in 2006-07 as president of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and in 2005-06 as president of the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association. In 2013, White was named one of four NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision recipients of the Under Armour AD of the Year Award presented by NACDA.

Guided by the Strategic Plan that was approved by Duke's Board of Trustees in April of 2008, White made an immediate impact on Duke Athletics. In addition to leading the department to unprecedented success in competition, he reshaped the organization into a more efficient and modern department; strengthened ties to both campus and community constituents through consistent outreach efforts; successfully oversaw Duke's fundraising efforts during an economic downturn; completed partnerships with major corporate entities to enhance revenue streams; commissioned a master facilities plan to position Duke well into the 21st Century; and emphasized a stronger commitment to the university's intramural, club and recreational sports programs.

Since White's arrival, Duke has captured four NCAA Championships - women's tennis in 2009, men's basketball in 2010 and men's lacrosse in 2010 and 2013 - and 15 ACC titles (three in 2013). On the strength of 19 teams participating in NCAA Championship competition and robust finishes in several sports, Duke ranked 12th in the 2013 Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings, which determine an institution's all-around strength in intercollegiate athletics. The 12th-place showing marked the 10th consecutive year that Duke has ended among the nation's top 20 programs. In 2011, Duke placed fifth, matching the school's best finish in the rankings and its 1171.50 points earned were the most in program history. In White's five years at Duke, the Blue Devils placed 17th (2009), 10th (2010), fifth (2011), 16th (2012) and 12th (2013) in the Directors' Cup standings.

Forty-eight Blue Devil teams ranked among the nation's top 10 teams during the past five seasons with eight - men's basketball (2009, 2010, 2011, 2013), men's lacrosse (2010, 2013) and women's tennis (2009, 2010) - reaching No. 1. In all, 75 Blue Devil teams advanced to NCAA postseason competition during White's Duke tenure.

Individually, 165 student-athletes earned All-America, 278 All-ACC and 171 All-Region or District honors the past five years. During White's tenure, Duke boasts 10 NCAA individual champions in Curtis Beach (indoor track and field heptathlon in 2012), Juliet Bottorff (outdoor track and field 10k in 2011), Mallory Cecil (women's tennis in 2009), Abby Johnston (three-meter diving in 2011), Nick McCrory (platform diving in 2010, 2011 and 2013), and Becca Ward (women's fencing, saber in 2009, 2011 and 2012). In 2012-13, Duke celebrated one individual NCAA and seven individual ACC titles.

Academically, Duke teams continued strong performances under White. In the 2013 spring semester, 25 of 26 Blue Devil varsity teams earned grade point averages of 3.0 or better and more than 90 made the Dean's List.

In two key elements in tracking a department's academic success, Duke ranked among the nation's best again. Duke posted a 98% Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and 16 teams achieved a 100% GSR. Also, an ACC-best 15 Blue Devil teams were ranked in the top 10% of their respective sports in the most recent Academic Performance Rate (APR) Report, including the men's basketball and football teams. In the 2013 report, Duke (989) ranked third among all FBS schools, behind only Northwestern (996) and Boise State (993), and eighth among all Division I - FBS and FCS - programs. In all, Duke totaled the highest APR scores among ACC institutions in 13 of the league's 25 sports: men's basketball (995), football (989), men's golf (1000), men's lacrosse (997), men's soccer (995), men's swimming and diving (1000), men's indoor track and field (1000), men's outdoor track and field (1000), women's golf (1000), women's lacrosse (1000), rowing (1000), volleyball (1000) and wrestling (1000).

Individually in 2013, seniors Abby Johnston (women's diving) and Anthony Lin (fencing) received prestigious NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Six Duke student-athletes were selected as CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, while 26 others received National Scholar-Athlete or Scholar All-America accolades. In White's five-year tenure, former women's tennis player Parker Goyer won a Rhodes Scholarship (2009), while track athlete Sally Liu (2009) and Allie Speidel (2011) earned Marshall Scholarships.

Under White, Duke has continued its focus on outreach to the local community. Modeling the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills program's commitment to service, learning projects and outreach, approximately 500 Duke student-athletes across all sports participated in a combined effort of more than 2,000 community service hours.

White's commitment to the overall mission of the university remains clear. In May 2011, Duke Athletics announced that a portion of ticket sales from Blue Devil regular season home sporting events will be directed to the Duke University Libraries. Per White's vision, the Duke Athletics Library Fund will generate significant unrestricted revenue for the Duke University Libraries to support teaching and research across the institution.

In fall of 2012, Duke University announced the \$3.25 billion Duke Forward fundraising campaign for priorities across Duke's 10 schools, Duke Medicine and a range of university programs. Included in the campaign is a \$250 million goal for Duke Athletics to be divided three ways - for facility enhancements and support (\$100 million), endowment income (\$50 million) and operating funds (\$100 million). In 2012-13, several facility projects were initiated, including the construction of new practice fields off Bassett Drive that will benefit Duke's lacrosse, soccer, recreation and club sports, and intramural programs.

White, who holds a Ph.D. in education, has taught graduate-level classes since 1982 and currently teaches a sports business course in Duke's Fuqua School of Business as part of Duke's MBA program.

In August 2003, SI.com (the Sports Illustrated web site) listed White, then at Notre Dame, third in its rankings of the most powerful people in college football. In January 2004, The Sporting News listed him in its Power 100 as third among five names in the "front office" category (and the lone college athletics director among the 100).

White previously served on numerous NCAA committees, including being an ex-officio member of the NCAA Committee on Academic Performance and a member of its Penalty and Rewards subcommittee. For several years, he was a representative with the football Bowl Championship Series. Additionally, White was part of the NCAA Coalition on Intercollegiate Athletics (COIA) that dealt with academics, fiscal reform and student-athlete well-being. In 2012, White was among a select group of college and professional administrators asked to serve on the recently formed Expert Advisory Board for the Knight Commission. Additionally, he was the secretary of NCAA Football, a non-profit corporation acting as the "collective voice to promote college football," and served on the Black Coaches and Administrators Board of Directors.

Given his background and success, it is not surprising that 23 current or former directors of athletics were mentored by White. That impressive list includes Jim Sterk of Washington State and San Diego State, Tom Boeh of Ohio University and Fresno State, Ian McCaw of Northeastern, Massachusetts and Baylor, Bruce Van De Velde formerly of Utah State, Iowa State and Louisiana Tech, Herman Frazier previously of Alabama-Birmingham and Hawaii, Rudy Keeling formerly of Emerson and previous commissioner of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), Scott Devine of St. Mary's College (Md.), Tom Collins formerly of Ball State, Tim Van Alstine formerly of Western Illinois, Mark Wilson of Tennessee Tech, Bubba Cunningham of Ball State, Tulsa and North Carolina, Sandy Barbour of Tulane and California-Berkeley, Jim Phillips of Northern Illinois and Northwestern, Bernard Muir of Georgetown, Delaware and Stanford, Sandy Hatfield Clubb of Drake, Vic Cegles of Long Beach State, Norwood Teague of Virginia Commonwealth and Minnesota, Bob Bierie previously of Loras College, Greg Capell previously of Loras College, Boo Corrigan of Army, Bill Scholl of Ball State, Josh Berlo of Minnesota Duluth, and Stan Wilcox of Florida State. Prior to joining Notre Dame in 2000, White served as athletic director at Arizona State University, Tulane University, the University of Maine and Loras College in Iowa, where he originated the National Catholic Basketball Tournament.

Before becoming an administrator, White served as head track and field coach at Southeast Missouri State (1981-82) and assistant cross country and track and field coach at Central Michigan (1976-80). He began his coaching career at Gulf High School in New Port Richey, Fla., coaching cross country and track and assisting in football and wrestling.

White earned his Ph.D. from Southern Illinois University in 1983 with an emphasis on higher education administration. In 1985, he completed postdoctoral work at Harvard University's Institute for Educational Management. He earned his master's degree in athletics administration from Central Michigan University in 1976 and his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1972 from St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, Ind., where he also competed as a sprinter.

White and his wife, Jane, a former college track and field coach, have five children and 10 grandchildren.

"The ACC tournament match against North Carolina, it was then when I saw that how well we were playing in doubles. That was the first time that I really thought that we could win the whole thing."

The Blue Devils earned the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and hosted the opening two rounds at Ambler Tennis Stadium. While they knew they had to be ready for every match, the one match circled on everyone's calendar was the potential quarterfinal contest with ACC rival Miami.

"We had this whole thing of thinking that the winner of us and Miami is going to win the national title," Ashworth said.

After clearing the way to College Station with wins over Richmond and Virginia, Ashworth noticed a certain swagger about his team.

"This was the first team I've ever had that wasn't going into the round of 16 with the mindset of, 'we could win it', but they honestly believed that they should win it, and it was such a noticeable thing," Ashworth said.

The Blue Devils met up with Arkansas in the round of 16 and for the first time since April 1, they lost the doubles point. Ashworth saw the loss as a wakeup call for his team. The squad quickly rebounded with four singles wins to earn a spot in the quarterfinal round against Miami.

The quarterfinal match that Duke circled had arrived and the Blue Devils were confident heading into the contest against the Hurricanes.

This time though, the match was filled with less drama. Duke took the doubles point with wins from Mang and Granson at No. 1 and Ellah Nze and Zsilinszka at No. 2.

Cecil came out on fire in singles and got off the court quickly with a 6-2, 6-1 win to give Duke a 2-0 lead in the match. Miami got a point back to make it 2-1. Unfolding on court four was perhaps the highlight of the match. Granson, who had lost to Michaela Kissell twice before, turned in a stellar performance. The junior dropped the opening set 6-3, but buckled down to take the next two sets 6-1, 6-3 and put Duke ahead 3-1. Zsilinszka clinched the match and sent Duke to its first semifinal appearance since 2003.

"We had a lot of confidence in that match, especially when we won doubles," Ashworth said. "We just had a belief that we were going to win. I think beating Miami in the quarters of the NCAA tournament was the biggest match for us the entire year, because it let our team realize that if we got by them, we could win the tournament."

As predicted, the quarterfinal proved to be Duke's toughest test of the tournament. The Blue Devils raced past Georgia 5-2 in the semifinals despite No. 1 Cecil losing her first match since March 22.

"I hate to see people lose, but it showed our team that we could beat a top five team without [Mallory] winning," Ashworth said. "It all started with the doubles."

Riding high on its 17-match win streak, Duke made it 18 with the biggest victory of the year on May 19. The Blue Devils took on No. 8 California in the title tilt and made quick work of the Bears in a 4-0 victory.

Doubles play was strong with wins at No. 2

and No. 3, and Zsilinszka made quick work of her opponent in singles action for the 2-0 lead. Then the magic started to unfold on courts five and six.

Playing in the final match of their careers, the senior tandem of Mang and Robinson stamped Duke's place in the history book as they won their matches within moments of each other. Robinson turned in a furious rally in the second set to come back from a 4-2 deficit to win 6-2, 6-4 at No. 6. At the opposite end of the stadium it was Mang punching the ticket for the Blue Devils with a forehand winner for the 6-1, 6-3 triumph at No. 5.

"It's unbelievable," Robinson said following the match. "I don't even have any words to describe the feeling. I love these girls and it's an amazing feeling."

"It hasn't quite sunk in yet, but it's unbelievable," Mang said. "I'm just so proud of these girls. To win this with Jess [Robinson] in our senior year is amazing. I could not ask for anything better."

Zsilinszka took home the tournament's Most Valuable Player Award after going 5-0 and not dropping a single set during the 10 days.

While the talent the Blue Devils possessed on the court was great, it was the team's ability to pull together and fight for each other throughout the season that led them to the top Ashworth believes.

"I think this was by far the closest team I had as far as trusting each other, believing in each other and wanting to win for each other," Ashworth said. "And I think that we had a lot of leaders in different ways and that really was so important to our success. I'm so proud of them. I couldn't have asked for more out of these girls."
