Duke's leading rusher in both 2006 and 2007 ... one of 11 active running backs in the ACC with over 1,000 career rushing yards (1,072) entering the season ... has rushed for 50 or more yards in seven career games including a career-best 123-yard effort versus Florida State on October 22, 2005 ... has gained 25 or more yards in 20 career contests ... owns a 4.3 career yards per carry average ... posted the 10th-longest rush from scrimmage in Blue Devil history with a 78-yard touchdown jaunt against Florida State on October 22, 2005 ... has seen action in 33 career games with 10 starting assignments.
