A well-rounded player with exceptional ball handling skills ... has the ability to run the point, hit the jumper and create off the dribble ... very strong and athletic ... played point guard as a freshman, shooting guard as a sophomore and wing as a junior.

Career Notes...

Owns 410 assists over her first three years at Duke, which ranks seventh on the Blue Devil charts ... is 27 points shy of becoming the 22^{nd} player in Duke history to reach the 1,000-point mark ... started 89 of 105 games played ... had one of the best all-around seasons as a freshman in school history ... dished out 154 assists as a freshman to rank tied for third on the Duke single-season charts ... collected Blue Devil freshman records for assists (154) and three-pointers made (41-tied) ... posted 34 points in the first two games of her career to rank as the third-best output for a Duke freshman in the opening two games ... on the Duke freshman charts, ranked fifth in points (394), third in steals (61), fifth in three-point field goal percentage (41.0) and fifth in double-figure scoring games (22).

As a Junior (2006-07)...

Started all 34 games ... averaged 9.4 points, 4.0 assists, 4.3 rebounds, and 1.1 steals ... received All-ACC Honorable Mention honors ... named Duke Student-Athlete of the Week (Feb.16) and ACC Player of the Week (Feb.12) ... had a season-high 18 points in a win over then 22nd-ranked Texas ... totaled 15 games scoring double-digits, including a 15-point effort in the win over Temple, which was an NCAA Tournament career best ... in ACC games only, finished 29th in scoring (10.9), 12th in field goal percentage (48.7), third in three-point field goal percentage (41.0), tied for ninth in assists (3.57) and 12th in assist/turnover ratio (1.09) ... in the overall ACC stats, ranked 12th in free throw percentage (75.5 percent), seventh in assists (3.97) and sixth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.52).

As a Sophomore (2005-06)...

Started 20 of 35 contests on the year ... started the final 19 games of the season at guard ... averaged 7.4 points, 3.5 assists, 2.7 rebounds and 1.2 steals ... posted 11 assists in only 17 minutes at Old Dominion, which ranked tied for fourth on Duke's single game charts ... in the ACC stats, ranked 12th with 3.46 assists and fourth with a 1.64 assist/turnover ratio ... totaled 10 games with double-figure points.

As a Freshman (2004-05)...

After coming off the bench in the season opener, started the next 35 straight games at point guard ... averaged 10.9 points, 4.3 assists, 2.8 rebounds and 1.7 steals ... earned All-ACC Freshman accolades ... selected to the GBallmag.com Young All-America Team ... in the ACC stats, ranked 27th in scoring (10.9), third in three-point field goal percentage (41.0), sixth in assists (4.3) and 12th in assist/turnover ratio (1.13) ... in ACC games only, ranked 27th in scoring (10.7), second in three-point field goal percentage (44.2), 15th in three-point field goals made (1.36), third in assists (4.86) and 13th in assist/turnover ratio (1.10) ... named ACC Rookie of the Week four times ... named Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament ... averaged a team-best 32.3 minutes a game, which was a Duke freshman record.

Averaged 19.8 points, 7.0 assists and 3.4 rebounds at Riverdale Baptist under the direction of Diane Richardson ... came off the bench to score 15 points, grab four rebounds and notch two steals in the McDonald's All-America game ... scored six points and had one rebound in the WBCA All-America contest ... a first team *Parade* All-America, third team *USA Today* All-America selection and honorable mention *Slam* Magazine All-America ... earned Gatorade Maryland Player of the Year ... *Washington Post* Metro Player of the Year ... Student Sports second team All-America ... had a career-high 42 points in a game as a senior ... ranked No. 14 prospect by All-Star Girls Report, No. 14 by All Game Sports and No. 15 by Blue Star Report ... led Riverdale to the National Christian League Championship in 2004 ... as a junior, averaged 21.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.0 assists, leading Riverdale to a 30-6 record ... a *Street & Smith's* third team All-America ... team finished fourth in the *Washington Post* Girls Basketball poll ... earned Prince George's County Player of the Year ... led Riverdale to the Independent & National Christian League Championship in 2003 ... as a sophomore at Fairfield, named to Ohio All-State team after averaging 25.0 points, 8.5 rebounds and 5.0 assists ... 2002 Ohio and GMC Co-Player of the Year ... selected to *Ohio Girls Basketball* Magazine Dream Team and *Cincinnati Enquirer* All-Star ... led her squad to the sectional and district championships ... attended the Nike All-America and adidas Top Ten Camps ... averaged 21.1 points and 8.1 rebounds as a freshman at Fairfield.

Summer of 2003...

Played for the gold medal-winning East Team at the USA Basketball Youth Developmental Festival ... led the team to a 5-0 record ... averaged 10.4 points, 2.6 rebounds and hit 18 of 20 free throws ... started three of the five games played.

A pure passer and ball handler ... has a very quick release on her shot ... will have the opportunity to see extensive time at point guard as a senior with the departure of National Player of the Year Lindsey Harding ... sat out the 2004-05 season after transferring from the University of Colorado ... excellent point guard and three-point shooter.

Carpor

In two years, has hit 40 of 126 three-pointers for a 31.7 percentage ... has seen action in 54 contests and owns a 1.2 assist/turnover ratio.

As a Junior at Duke (2006-07)...

Saw playing time in 31 of 34 games, averaging 3.6 points, 1.5 rebounds and 1.2 assists while playing 15.0 minutes per game ... had a career-high 12 points in the win over Dartmouth, going 4-of-8 from the field ... played a career-high 23 minutes against Miami and pulled down a career-high seven boards ... also had a career-high four steals in the Jan. 13 win over then-top-ranked Maryland ... hit 26 three-pointers, which ranked third on the Duke squad ... nailed at least one three-pointer in 21 of 34 games and had a streak of 14 straight games with at least one three pointer.

As a Sophomore at Duke (2005-06) ...

Saw action in 23 contests, while averaging 2.3 points and 1.0 assists in 8.8 minutes a game ... hit 14 of 39 three-pointers for a 35.9 percentage ... played a career-high 16 minutes against Arkansas St. as she scored a career-high eight points, hitting 2-of-3 treys ... dished out a career-best four assists against St. John's ... hit two or more three-pointers against four opponents.

As a Freshman at Colorado (2003-04) ...

Started eight of 30 games played at the guard position ... averaged 7.1 points, 1.8 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 1.3 steals a contest ... a two-time Big 12 Freshman of the Week selection ... became the first true freshman to start a game for Colorado since Randie Wirt in 2000-01 ... kicked off her career with 17 points, two rebounds, two assists and one steal against Old Dominion ... in the ODU game, hit a careerbest five three-pointers in 31 minutes ... scored double-figure points in eight contests ... hit 51 three-pointers on the season with a 39.2 percentage ... her 39.2 percentage ranked 10th in the Big 12, while her 1.7 three-pointers per game ranked seventh ... matched her career high with 17 points against Syracuse ... hit the game-winning shot against Notre Dame on Nov. 15, finishing with 10 points.

Attended ThunderRidge H.S., where she was named Colorado Miss Basketball as a senior ... led ThunderRidge to the 5A State Championship in her final year under head coach Ron Burgin with a 23-1 record ... averaged 17.8 points, 6.2 assists, 3.6 steals and 3.1 rebounds as a senior ... hit 63.2 percent from the floor and 52.4 percent

from three-point range ... as a senior, selected *Denver Post* Miss Basketball, Joint Effort High School Player of the Year, 5A State Tournament MVP, *Denver Post* All-Colorado, *Rocky Mountain News* All-Colorado, 5A first team All-State, first team All-Continental League ... nominated for McDonald's and WBCA All-America, while being named *Student Sports* Magazine Honorable Mention All-America ... earned MVP of "The Show II" All-Star Showcase and made the Nike Tournament of Champions All-Tournament team ... as a junior, averaged 15.0 points, 5.9 assists, 3.4 steals and 3.5 rebounds ... led ThunderRidge to the state semifinals with a 21-3 record ... selected *Rocky Mountain News* All-Colorado, first team All-State by the *Rocky Mountain News*, Honorable Mention All-State by the *Denver Post*, first team All-Continental League and 2002 *Street & Smith's* Honorable Mention All-America ... participated in the 2002 adidas All-America Camp, 2002 USA Basketball Olympic Development Festival, "The Show" All-Star Showcase and was named TRHS Hoopster of the Year ... as a sophomore, averaged 13.4 points and 3.4 rebounds, leading the team to a 17-5 record ... freshman year averaged 7.6 points and 2.5 rebounds ... lettered all four years at ThunderRidge leading the Grizzlies to an 82-12 record ... led ThunderRidge to the 2002 Continental League Championship, 2001 League Runner-up, 2000 Prairie League Championship, 2000 4A State Qualifier and 2002 5A State Semifinals ... her AAU team, the Colorado Hoopsters, was the 2001 Nike Cup Champion, 2002 U.S. Junior Nationals Runner-up and 2002 Nike Cup Finalist ... lettered in track and was a state qualifier in the open 400 meter dash.
