- The Duke football locker room is closed to the media at all times
- Following all home games, **David Cutcliffe** and selected student-athletes will address the media in the team meeting room on the second floor of the Yoh Football Center ... Road accommodations for Cutcliffe and Duke players to meet with the media will be made based on the respective facility

2010 DUKE FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

40 LETTERMEN, 18 STARTERS RETURN

- Duke returns 40 lettermen and 18 starters from its 2009 team that went 5-7 overall and 3-5 in ACC play
- First team All-ACC WR **Donovan Varner** (65 rec., 1,047 yards, 8 TDs) spearheads the list of nine offensive returnees that includes four linemen
- Junior S **Matt Daniels** (83 tackles) is the leading returning tackler from a year ago while senior LB **Damian Thornton** (60 tackles) and redshirt junior NG **Charlie Hatcher** (39 tackles; 7.0 TFL) also return
- All three specialist starters are back in redshirt sophomore LS **Jackson Anderson**, redshirt senior P **Kevin Jones** and redshirt junior K **Will Snyderwine**

SEVEN STARTERS LOST FROM 2009

- Headlined by QB **Thaddeus Lewis** and DT **Vince Oghobaase**, Duke loses 15 lettermen and seven starters from last year's squad
- A two-time second team All-ACC pick, Lewis became Duke's career leader in pass attempts (1,510), pass completions (877), passing yards (10,065) and passing touchdowns (67) while Oghobaase, who earned third team All-America honors in 2009, finished his career ranking among the school's top 10 in both career tackles for loss (36.5; 6th) and quarterback sacks (14.0; 5th)
- Other starters lost to graduation include S **Calron Gainey** (84 tackles in 2009), OT **Jarrod Holt** (1,348 career snaps), DE **Ayanga Okpokowuruk** (11.0 career sacks), LB **Vincent Rey** (330 career tackles; 2nd team All-ACC in 2009) and CB **Leon Wright** (10 career interceptions; HM All-ACC in 2009)

NOTING THE 2009 CAMPAIGN

- Duke's five victories last year marked the program's highest win total since 1994 when the Blue Devils went 8-4
- The Blue Devils won three road games to push their record in away tilts to 4-6 under head coach **David Cutcliffe** ... Duke had posted a road record of 3-42 in its previous eight seasons
- Led by QB **Thaddeus Lewis**, Duke ranked first in the ACC and ninth nationally in passing offense by averaging 305.0 yards per game
- Five Blue Devils received All-ACC recognition while DT **Vince Oghobaase** was a third team All-America choice by *Sporting News*
- Duke led the conference with 11 Academic All-ACC selections including two-time pick P **Kevin Jones**

FIVE DEVILS INK NFL FREE AGENT CONTACTS

- In the spring of 2010, five Duke players signed free agent contracts with respective NFL organizations
- QB **Thaddeus Lewis** (St. Louis Rams), DT **Vince Oghobaase** (Miami Dolphins), DE **Ayanga Okpokowuruk** (New York Giants), LB **Vincent Rey** (Cincinnati Bengals) and CB **Leon Wright** (New York Giants) all reached agreements with professional franchises

HEAD COACH DAVID CUTCLIFFE

- Entering his third season atop the Blue Devil gridiron program is **David Cutcliffe**
- A native of Birmingham, Ala., Cutcliffe has guided Duke to nine wins in his first two seasons after the program had amassed 10 total victories in the previous 93 outings
- Overall, Cutcliffe is 53-44 as a head coach including a 9-15 ledger with the Blue Devils

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- In December of 2009, **Mike MacIntyre**, Duke's defensive coordinator in 2008-09, departed the staff to accept the head coaching position at San Jose State
- **Marion Hobby** was promoted to assistant head coach/defensive coordinator while **Jim Collins** was promoted to assistant defensive coordinator/linebackers
- **Jim Knowles**, the head coach at Cornell from 2004-09, was added to the coaching staff to serve as defensive coordinator/safeties
- **Matt Lubick**, a member of the Arizona State staff for the past three seasons, joined the Duke program last spring as passing game coordinator and recruiting coordinator, replacing **Scottie Montgomery** who departed Duke after accepting an assistant coaching slot with the Pittsburgh Steelers
- Former Duke standout WR **Jomar Wright** joined the staff as a graduate assistant coach after serving the last two seasons at Presbyterian College ... Wright, who caught 122 passes for 1,638 yards and nine TDs in his career from 2004-07, replaced **Charles Clark**, who joined MacIntyre on the staff at San Jose State

THREE ENROLL IN JANUARY

- Three players — QB **Brandon Connette**, TE **Cooper Helfet** & RB **Josh Snead** — enrolled at Duke in January for the spring, 2010 semester
- Connette (Corona, Calif.) and Snead (Smithfield, N.C.) both graduated from high school early while Helfet (Kentfield, Calif.) joined the Blue Devils after playing the last two seasons at Santa Rosa (Calif.) Junior College

REPLACING LEWIS

- The Blue Devils must replace four-year starting QB **Thaddeus Lewis**, who set or tied 56 school records and finished his career as one of just two players in ACC history to throw for more than 10,000 yards (N.C. State's Philip Rivers), and will do so with four scholarship QBs on the roster in 2010
- Redshirt sophomore **Sean Renfree** served as the backup to Lewis in 2009 and completed 34-of-50 (.680) passes for 330 yards with four TDs and two INTs before suffering a season-ending knee injury against Georgia Tech on November 14 ... Renfree underwent surgery to repair the torn ACL in his right knee on November 23 and his availability was limited for spring drills
- Redshirt freshman **Sean Schroeder** (third string QB in 2009) and true freshman **Brandon Connette** (enrolled at Duke in January) split the spring practice snaps in Renfree's absence
- Freshman **Anthony Boone**, who signed a national letter of intent on February 3, joined the program in July

SWITCHING SIDES

- Two Blue Devils switched from offense to defense for spring practice as **Johnny Williams** moved from wide receiver to cornerback while **Kenny Anunike** shifted from tight end to defensive end

POST-SPRING TESTING

- Redshirt junior WR **Matt Pridemore** was crowned the fastest member of the program with a recorded 40-yard dash time of 4.33 seconds
- Junior S **Lee Butler** carded the second-best 40 time at 4.38
- On the weightlifting front, redshirt senior OG **Brandon Harper** and senior LB **Damian Thornton** posted the top bench press mark at 455 pounds

EXPERIENCE LEADERS

- Senior C **Bryan Morgan** enters his final season with the Blue Devils having started 24 straight games and is the active leader in snaps played with 2,017
- Behind Morgan, the most experienced Duke players are redshirt junior OT **Kyle Hill** (1,693 snaps), redshirt senior CB **Chris Rwabukamba** (1,357), redshirt senior DE **Wesley Oglesby** (1,251) and redshirt senior TE **Brett Huffman** (1,200)

TOP TRIO OF WIDE RECEIVERS

- In senior **Austin Kelly**, junior **Donovan Varner** and sophomore **Conner Vernon**, the Blue Devils boast one of the top wide receiver trios in the nation
- Last year, the group combined for 174 receptions for 2,418 yards and 15 TDs
- Varner paced the squad with 65 catches for 1,047 yards and eight TDs ... The Miami, Fla., native led the ACC in receptions per game (5.42) and receiving yards per game (87.2)
- Vernon added 55 receptions for 746 yards and three TDs ... Also a native of Miami, he set school rookie records for catches, receiving yards and 100-yard games (3)
- Kelly, a product of Mableton, Ga., chipped in 54 grabs for 625 yards and four TDs and is one of just five returning ACC players to have caught at least two passes in all 12 regular season games a year ago
- Varner was a first team All-ACC selection in 2009 while Vernon received first team Freshman All-America honors from *Sporting News*

REDSHIRT SENIOR ENDS ON BOTH SIDES

- Duke's offense will feature a pair of redshirt senior TEs in **Brett Huffman** and **Brandon King** ... The two enter the 2010 campaign having combined for 59 pass receptions for 633 yards and nine TDs
- On defense, redshirt senior DEs **Patrick Egbob** and **Wesley Oglesby** are back for their fifth season of eligibility ... The tandem has combined for 132 tackles, 17.5 tackles for loss and 6.0 quarterback sacks

RWABUKAMBA CHOSEN IN CFL DRAFT

- Redshirt senior CB **Chris Rwabukamba** was a fourth round selection of the Hamilton Tiger-Cats in the 2010 Canadian Football League Draft
- In 34 career games as a Blue Devil, Rwabukamba has compiled 72 tackles, 12 pass breakups and one INT

ACC ACTIVE LEADER

- Duke redshirt senior P **Kevin Jones** enters his final season as the ACC's active leader in both punts and punting yardage
- Nationally, Jones ranks fourth in punts and sixth in punting yards among active players
- In 36 career games, the Austin, Texas, native has punted 200 times for 7,890 yards (38.45) with 55 boots downed inside the opponent 20 yardline against just 13 touchbacks
- On Duke's career charts, Jones ranks sixth in punts, sixth in punting yards and 12th in yards per punt average
- Jones is a two-time selection to the Academic All-ACC squad in 2008 and 2009

PAT STREAKS

- Both senior K **Nick Maggio** and redshirt junior K **Will Snyderwine** enter the 2010 season with streaks for consecutive successful PATs
- Maggio has booted 50 straight extra points for the longest active streak in the ACC and the third-longest streak in Duke history ... Snyderwine's run stands at 24 consecutive PATs
- The Duke record for consecutive successful PATs is 62 held by **Sims Lenhardt**

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Headlined by junior WR **Donovan Varner**, several Blue Devils received preseason honors from the various national publications
- Varner was a preseason All-ACC pick by *Athlon Sports*, *Blue Ribbon*, *Lindy's*, *Phil Steele's College Football Preview* and *YAHOO! Sports* while earning the "Best Hands" superlative for ACC receivers from *Lindy's* and *Sporting News* ... *Lindy's* also tabbed the Miami, Fla., product as the 16th-best wide receiver in the nation
- Redshirt junior K **Will Snyderwine** was a preseason second team All-ACC choice by *Athlon Sports* and *Phil Steele's College Football Preview*
- Redshirt junior OT **Kyle Hill** was a preseason third team All-ACC choice by *Athlon Sports* and fourth team selection by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview*
- Junior S **Matt Daniels** was a preseason third team all-league pick by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview* while redshirt senior TE **Brett Huffman** was a fourth team

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED

- Redshirt junior K **Will Snyderwine**, a non-scholarship roster member for the past two seasons, was awarded a scholarship for the 2010 season
- In 2009, Snyderwine earned second team All-ACC honors after setting a school single-season record with 17 field goals in 20 attempts while making all 24 PATs

GAMBLE SHINES IN DISCUS

- In the spring of 2010, sophomore LB **Austin Gamble** became the first athlete in Duke track and field history to qualify for the NCAA Championships in the discus where he finished 20th (164-3)
- Gamble set the school record in the discus (180-10) at the NCAA Eastern Preliminary Round and also placed third at the ACC Championships to earn All-ACC honors (179-5)
- The Weston, Fla., native won the discus championship (175-8) at the Penn Relays, becoming the first Duke athlete to do so since **James O'Leary** in 1950

SPRING GAME REVIEW

- Freshman QB **Brandon Connette** rushed for 91 yards and one touchdown while throwing for 67 yards and another score to lead the Blue squad past the White unit, 24-3, in the annual Spring Game on March 27
- The Blue unit grinded out 232 yards on the ground behind the running of sophomore RB **Desmond Scott** (13 carries for 97 yards), Connette (13-91) and redshirt sophomore RB **Patrick Kurunwune** (13-44)
- The White team was led by freshman RB **Josh Snead's** 99-yard performance on the ground while redshirt junior DE **Kenny Anunike** posted a game-high nine tackles including two for loss
- Connette and redshirt freshman OT **Perry Simmons** shared the Most Improved Offensive Player honor while redshirt freshman LB **Kevin Rojas** received the Most Improved Defensive Player award ... Junior S **Jeffrey Faris** was the recipient of the Blue Devil Heart Award

GAME NO. 950 KICKS OFF 2010 SEASON

- Duke's season-opening game against Elon on September 4 will mark the school's 950th all-time football contest
- Duke owns an all-time record of 453-465-31 in 96 seasons of competition

2010 SLATE RANKS THIRD-TOUGHEST IN ACC

- Duke's 12 opponents combined for a 94-60 (.610) record last season with eight schools (Alabama [14], Boston College [8], Elon [9], Georgia Tech [11], Miami [9], North Carolina [8], Navy [10] and Virginia Tech [10]) posting eight or more victories
- Based on opponents' combined winning percentage, Duke will face the ACC's third-most difficult schedule in 2010, trailing only North Carolina (.97-60; .618) and Virginia Tech (.95-59; .617) and ahead of Miami (.92-61; .601), N.C. State (.91-64; .587), Georgia Tech (.87-64; .576), Florida State (.86-66; .566), Virginia (.82-73; .529), Maryland (.79-72; .523), Wake Forest (.77-76; .503), Clemson (.72-79; .477) and Boston College (.68-80; .460)
- The Blue Devils are joined by Miami as the only two ACC schools that will face ledgers including four opponents that reached double figures in the win column in 2009

ALABAMA TO VISIT WALLACE WADE STADIUM

- In week three (September 18), reigning national champion Alabama will visit Durham as Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** faces his alma mater
- Cutcliffe, a native of Birmingham and 1976 graduate of Alabama, worked as an undergraduate assistant coach for the Crimson Tide under Hall of Fame head coach **Paul "Bear" Bryant**
- As the head coach at Ole Miss, Cutcliffe compiled a 2-4 record against his alma mater with wins in 2001 (27-24) and 2003 (43-28) and defeats in 1999 (30-24), 2000 (45-7), 2002 (42-7) and 2004 (28-7)
- Duke is 1-2 all-time against the Crimson Tide with a 29-26 win in the Sugar Bowl on January 1, 1945 and losses in 1972 (35-12) and 2006 (30-14)
- The Blue Devils are 3-8 all-time against teams that captured the national championship the previous season and hold a 2-1 home ledger in such games with wins over 1937 champion Pittsburgh (7-0 on November 26, 1938) and 1951 champion Tennessee (7-0 on October 4, 1952) and a loss to 1990 champion Georgia Tech (17-6 on November 2, 1991)
- Duke's stadium namesake, **Wallace Wade**, coached at both Alabama (61-13-2 record from 1923-30) and Duke (110-36-7 record from 1931-41; 46-50), guided both schools to Rose Bowl appearances (1925, 1926, 1930, 1938 & 1941) and led the Crimson Tide to national championships in 1925, 1926 and 1930 before being inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1955
- Wade's bust sits outside the north entrance of the stadium that bears his name in Durham while a bronze statue of the legendary coach stands outside of Alabama's Bryant-Denny Stadium alongside Bryant, **Frank Thomas** and **Gene Stallings**

DUKE TO FACE 11TH HEISMAN TROPHY WINNER

- Alabama's trip to Durham on September 18 will bring the 11th Heisman Trophy winner to face the Blue Devils in Crimson Tide RB **Mark Ingram**
- Ingram captured college football's top honor last year after rushing for 1,542 yards and 15 TDs

EIGHT 2010 FOES REACHED POSTSEASON

- Seven of Duke's foes participated in bowl games last year with three winners (Alabama, 37-21 over Texas in the BCS National Championship game; Virginia Tech, 37-14 over Tennessee in the Chick-fil-A Bowl; and Navy, 35-13 over Missouri in the Texas Bowl) while Elon earned a berth in the 2009 FCS playoffs
- Other 2010 opponents to play in bowl games last year include Boston College (lost 24-13 to Southern California in the Emerald Bowl), Georgia Tech (lost 24-14 to Iowa in the Orange Bowl), Miami (lost 20-14 to Wisconsin in the Champs Sports Bowl) and North Carolina (lost 19-17 to Pittsburgh in the Meineke Car Care Bowl)

50TH ANNIVERSARY FOR COTTON BOWL CHAMPS

- This year marks the 50th anniversary of Duke's 1960 squad that went 8-3, captured the ACC championship and defeated Arkansas, 7-6, in the Cotton Bowl
- Under the direction of head coach **Bill Murray**, the Blue Devils finished the year ranked 10th nationally in the final Associated Press poll
- **Butch Allie** and **Art Browning** served as team captains
- Browning, **Dwight Bumgarner**, **Mark Leggett** and **Tee Moorman** earned All-ACC honors
- Moorman was a first team All-America choice after catching 54 passes for 476 yards and three TDs
- Leggett paced the team in rushing with 444 yards while quarterback **Don Altman** completed 80-of-119 (.672) passes for 635 yards and three TDs
- The 1960 Duke team will be honored during Duke's home game against Miami on October 16

HINES EARNS HALL OF FAME BID

- Former Duke standout wide receiver **Clarkston Hines** is one of 14 individuals in the 2010 College Football Hall of Fame Football Bowl Subdivision Class ... Hines will be enshrined at the National Football Foundation Annual Awards Dinner on December 7, 2010, at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City
- Hines starred for the Blue Devils from 1986-89 and finished his career with 189 pass receptions for 3,318 yards and 38 touchdowns ... As a senior in 1989, he earned ACC Player of the Year honors while helping Duke win a share of the conference championship with a 6-1 league record. Hines received first team All-America accolades in both 1988 and 1989
- A native of Chapel Hill, N.C., Hines holds school career records for pass receptions, receiving yards, receiving touchdowns and 100-yard receiving games (17) while holding school single-season standards for receiving yards (1,149 in 1989), receiving touchdowns (17 in 1989), 100-yard receiving games (6 in both 1987 & 1988) and total points (104 in 1989)
- On the ACC's career lists, Hines continues to rank first in touchdown receptions, first in 100-yard receiving games, third in receiving yards and ninth in pass receptions. A three-time first team All-ACC selection, he is the only player in league history to pace the conference in receiving yardage three consecutive seasons and continues to hold the conference single-season record for touchdown catches
- Hines becomes the 10th former Duke player to earn induction into the College Football Hall of Fame
