Powers led the Big Four hitting with an average of .417. Lewis led the Big Four pitchers with 4-2 mark. Werber, Bergeron, Groat, Johnson, Lewis and Powers named to the All-Big Four team, with Werber named most valuable player and Coombs outstanding coach.

Groat was named shortstop and Werber the first baseman on the Conference Southern Division team as selected by the Southern Conference Sports Writers Association.

After blanking Clemson 5-0 in the finals of the Southern Conference Tournament at Greensboro which Duke won, pitcher Bob Davis was selected outstanding player of the tourney. He allowed only four hits and struck out 13 batters.
