#### The First Pitch

The Duke Blue Devils recorded 24 wins in 2002, the most since Duke finished 24-31 in 1999. Despite battling injuries during the home stretch of the season, Duke knocked off No. 3 Wake Forest on May 18 and got past Maryland in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament on May 21. The Blue Devils won three of their last seven games, with all of the losses coming to teams ranked in the top 10 nationally.

#### Around the Horn

Duke finished the season with 24 wins, including 18 at home for the second consecutive year ... Duke knocked off Wake Forest, 6-2, on May 18, the Blue Devils' first win over a ranked opponent since May 13, 2001 ... Junior 1B Larry Broadway (3rd round, Montreal Expos) and senior SS Kevin Kelly (fifth round, San Francisco Giants) became the first Duke duo ever to be selected in the first five rounds of the Major League Baseball draft ... Kelly led the team with a .350 batting average, 59 runs, nine home runs, four triples (tied), eight stolen bases and a .561 slugging percentage. He was tied for second on the team with 15 doubles and was third with 51 RBIs. He had hitting streaks of 10, 11 and 14 games... Broadway led the ACC in walks and had a team-high .452 on-base percentage. He led the team with 53 runs batted in, was second with eight home runs and 15 doubles (tied) and fourth with a .323 batting average ... Junior OF Brian Patrick hit .344, the second-highest batting average on the team, and led the squad with 17 doubles and four triples (tied). He was second on the team with a .533 slugging percentage and 52 RBIs and third with five home runs and 113 total bases. He finished the season with a season-long 10-game hitting streak ... Junior OF Doug Bechtold was third on the team with a .336 batting average and hit .402 (35-87) over the last 34 games ... Sophomore RHP Justin Dilucchio led the Blue Devils with a 4.91 ERA and was tied for the team lead with five wins ... Junior RHP Jeff Alleva led Duke with 13 starts and was tied for tops on the team with five wins ... Sophomore RHP Greg Burke led the Blue Devils with 57 strikeouts despite suffering a season-ending injury on April 19. He was second on the team with 11 starts and a 5.13 ERA ... Freshman RHP Paul DeMarco was third on the squad with a 5.49 ERA and had three saves in 21 games ... Freshman LHP Tim Layden was named to Baseball America's Freshman All-America second team as a utility player. He pitched a team-high 73.2 innings, posting a 4-8 record with 55 strikeouts in 16 appearances and started 50 games offensively.

# Broadway, Kelly Selected in Major League Baseball Draft

Duke junior 1B Larry Broadway and senior SS Kevin Kelly were selected in the third and fifth rounds, respectively, of the Major League Baseball Draft on June 4. The duo is the first pair of Duke players to be chosen in the first five rounds of a single draft. Broadway, the 77th overall pick by the Montreal Expos, was the highest Duke player selected since Scott Schoeneweis was taken in the third round of the 1996 draft. Kelly was sekected by the San Francisco Giants with the 157th overall pick.

### Layden Earns Freshman All-America Honors

P/OF/DH **Tim Layden** was named to *Baseball America*'s Freshman All-America second team as a utility player. A native of Deer Park, N.Y., Layden played in 54 games offensively and led Duke with 73.2 innings pitched. An extremely versatile player, Layden played four positions during the year (LF, RF, 1B, P) in addition to serving as the designated hitter.

### Blue Devils Top Maryland in ACC Tournament

Duke defeated Maryland, 10-9, in the ACC Tournament on May 21. The win gave the Blue Devils 24 on the season, the most for a Duke squad since 1999. Duke took three out of four games from the Terrapins in 2002.

#### **Lone Senior Leads Team**

Kevin Kelly, the only senior on the Blue Devil squad, led Duke in nearly every offensive category. He was the team leader with a .350 batting average, nine home runs, 83 hits, 59 runs scored, four triples (tied), eight stolen bases, 133 total bases and a .561 slugging percentage. He was third with 51 RBIs, just two off the team lead. Kelly was one of only two Blue Devil players to have started all 58 games in 2002.

# Patrick Finishes Season With 10-Game Hitting Streak

Junior **Brian Patrick** extended his hitting streak to a season-best 10 games with a single in the eighth inning against Georgia Tech on May 23. He hit .488 (20-41) with four doubles, a triple, two home runs, 13 runs scored and 12 RBIs during the streak.

### **Kelly on Career Charts**

With a sensational senior year, SS Kevin Kelly climbed Duke's career leaders lists in

several categories. He finished his career among the top five in four statistical categories and the top 10 in six. Kelly ranks in Duke's all-time top 10 in games played (2nd, 222), games started (2nd, 221), at bats (3rd, 846), doubles (5th, 55), hits (6th, 255) and RBIs (9th, 142), is 11th in walks (99) and tied for 12th in runs scored (150).

### Patrick En Fuego

Brian Patrick was nearly unstoppable at the plate over the final 14 games of the season. The junior from Pompano Beach, Fla., hit .491 (26-53) with 18 runs scored and 16 RBIs in the last 14 contests, raising his batting average from .301 to .344. He had at least two base hits in 10 of the last 14 games, including a six-game multiple-hit hitting streak. Patrick finished the season with a 10-game hitting streak in which he hit .488 (20-41) with four doubles, a triple, two home runs, 13 runs scored and 12 RBIs.

### Stanley Sizzles in St. Pete

Freshman 3B **Grant Stanley** got his ACC Tournament career off on the right track with a 3-5 performance against Maryland on May 21. The three hits, including a double, equaled his career-best day. The Henderson, Nev., native had also registered three hits in a game on March 29 against Brown and on April 27 against Maryland. During Duke's three ACC Tournament games, Stanley hit .455 (5-11) with two doubles, three runs scored and three runs batted in.

### Begley Makes Second Career Start against No. 1 FSU

Sophomore RHP Colin Begley made his first start of the year and the second of his career against top-ranked Florida State in the ACC Tournament on May 22. Before giving up three runs in the seventh inning, Begley had limited the Seminoles to two runs in six innings. In his longest outing of the year (6.2 innings), Begley gave up five runs on nine hits and three walks and struck out one.

### Kelly Extends Hitting Streak to 10 Games

With a 3-4 night at the plate against Maryland on May 21, senior SS **Kevin Kelly** extended his hitting streak to 10 games. During the streak, Kelly hit .476 (20-42) with four doubles, two home runs, two stolen bases, four walks, 10 runs and 12 RBIs. Kelly previously had hitting streaks of 11 and 14 games during the season.

# DeMarco Pitches Duke to Victory in ACC Tourney

Freshman RHP **Paul DeMarco** turned in his longest outing since March 30 and the second-longest of his career, pitching 6.0 solid innings of relief to lead Duke to a 10-9 victory over Maryland in the ACC Tournament. DeMarco allowed three runs on eight hits and one walk while striking out four to earn his third win of the season and his first since pitching 7.0 innings in a start against Brown on March 30.

### Perry Gets First Start of the Season Against Wake Forest

Junior P **Kevin Perry** made his first start of the season on May 19 against Wake Forest, pitching 6.0 solid innings. The Bremen, Ga., native scattered six hits and three walks in the first six innings before giving up two hits in the seventh. He struck out two and allowed four runs in the game. The outing was his longest of the season and second-longest of his career.

### Jerdan Records Three-Game Doubles Streak

Sophomore OF **Drew Jerdan** hit a double in three consecutive games against Wake Forest May 17-19 and finished the season with seven doubles.

# Schreiber Records First Complete Game of Career

Sophomore P Zach Schreiber pitched the first complete game of his career, defeating the third-ranked Wake Forest Demon Deacons on May 18. The right-hander from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, allowed just two runs while scattering seven hits and four walks in nine innings. ### **Kelly Turns Up Power**

Senior SS **Kevin Kelly** finished his home career with a bang. In his final series at Jack Coombs Field, Kelly hit two home runs, taking over the team lead with nine homers on the season. Kelly's two-run home run in the third inning on Friday gave Duke a 3-2 lead and his two-run shot in the fourth on Saturday evened the score in the eventual Blue Devil victory over Wake Forest.

### Patrick Leads Duke Past Old Dominion

Junior RF Brian Patrick continued his recent tear through opposing pitchers with a

three-hit night against the Old Dominion Monarchs on May 15. Patrick led the Blue Devils to victory with a double, triple, home run, walk, three runs and two RBIs. He scored both the tying run in the ninth inning and the winning run in the 10th.

#### **Blue Devils Sweep ODU**

The Blue Devils completed a two-game sweep of Old Dominion with their 6-5 win in Norfolk, Va., on May 15. Duke also defeated ODU, 7-2, on Feb. 13 in Durham.

### Begley Earns First Career Victory

Sophomore **Colin Begley** earned his first collegiate win with two scoreless innings in relief on May 15 against Old Dominion.

### Sember Makes Second Career Start Against ODU

Freshman LHP Ryan Sember made his second collegiate start on the mound for the Blue Devils against ODU on May 15. The Boca Raton, Fla., native pitched eight innings, allowing five runs (three earned). He gave up all five runs on eight hits and an error in the first three innings before settling down to pitch five more scoreless innings, scattering just three hits. He had a no-decision in the Blue Devils' extra-inning victory.

#### Injury Bug Bites Duke Pitchers

Four Duke starting pitchers were sent to the bench with injuries in the final weeks of the season. Sophomore Greg Burke (elbow), junior Jeff Alleva (shoulder) and sophomore Justin Dilucchio (elbow) missed at least the final three weeks of the year, while freshman Tim Layden (shoulder) missed three weeks before making a relief appearance in the ACC Tournament. Those four pitchers had a combined 63 appearances, including 39 starts, although only Layden saw action (3.1 IP) on the mound after May 7. They accounted for 67 percent (39 of 58) of the team's starts, 63 percent (15 of 24) of the wins, 57 percent (195 of 342) of the strikeouts and 53 percent (271.1 of 511.0) of the team's innings pitched. Burke, who led the team in innings pitched at the time of his injury, has not pitched since April 19. Alleva's last appearance was May 5 and Dilucchio's was May 6. Layden last pitched once since May 7. Junior Kevin Thompson, who led the team with seven wins last season, did not pitch this year while rehabilitating from offseason surgery.

### Begley Blasts Home Run in First Career At Bat

Sophomore P **Colin Begley** blasted a tworun homer over the right field wall in the first plate appearance of his career on May 12 against North Carolina. The Nashville, Tenn., native was 1-2 at the plate on the day.

#### **Bechtold Finds Rhythm**

After struggling early in the season, junior OF **Doug Bechtold** found his rhythm. The Lancaster, Pa., native hit .385 (30-78) with nine doubles, 22 runs scored and 11 RBIs over the last 26 games. Since March 18, the centerfielder hit .402 (35-87) in 34 games and raised his batting average from a season-low .161 to .336.

### Furlow Collects First Career Base Hit

With a single to center field in the ninth inning against Florida State on May 7, junior T. Furlow collected the first base hit of his collegiate career. The Durham, N.C., native saw action in nine games during the season, recording one hit, one walk and two runs scored in seven at bats. Additionally, he made two appearances on the mound for the Blue Devils.

### Jerdan Makes First Pitching Appearance of the Year

Sophomore **Drew Jerdan**, who made nine appearances on the mound last season, made his first pitching appearance of 2002 on May 5 at Florida State. He allowed two earned runs in 2.0 innings against the Seminoles.

### Consistent Patrick Solid At Plate, On Mound

Junior OF/P Brian Patrick was a consistent

fixture in the 2002 Blue Devil lineup. Patrick led the team with 17 doubles, tied for the team lead with four triples, was second with a .344 batting average, .533 slugging percentage and 52 RBIs and third with five home runs and 113 total bases. The Pompano Beach, Fla., native also provided depth on the mound, making 11 relief appearances and two starts. He pitched 1.1 perfect innings against top-ranked Clemson April 20-21 and 2.0 scoreless innings against No. 18 East Carolina on April 23. On March 30 against Brown, Patrick pitched 2.1 innings in relief to earn the win and helped himself out with a grand slam.

### **Kelly Records Career Year**

A .273 career hitter entering his senior season, SS Kevin Kelly had a career year in 2002. The senior hit .350 with 15 doubles, four triples and nine home runs in 2002. In 164 career games prior to this year, Kelly had just one triple and four home runs. Kelly's previous best season was last year when he batted .304 with 15 doubles, one triple and two home runs.

### Broadway's Patience Pays Off

Junior 1B Larry Broadway led the ACC in walks in 2002. He walked 50 times during the season, 19 more times than his previous career total. Broadway ranks third on Duke's single-season list and was five walks shy of the Blue Devils' single-season record. Broadway's 0.9 walk per game ranked him first in the ACC and his .452 on-base percentage was tops on the team. Broadway's patience translated to runs scored as he established a new season high with 42 runs scored, the third-highest total on the team.

### Smith's Consistency Leads to Solid Year

Sophomore 2B Bryan Smith was one of the team's most consistent players, stringing together hitting streaks of 10 and 12 games during the season. One of two players to have started all 58 games for the Blue Devils, Smith has made great strides since his freshman season. After hitting .200 with two doubles and eight RBIs in 27 games (18 starts) last year, Smith recorded a .280 batting average with 13 doubles, three home runs and 31 RBIs this season.

#### **Hillier Leads Blue Devils**

Head coach **Bill Hillier** has guided the Blue Devils to more Atlantic Coast Conferece wins (19) in the first three years of his tenure than any Duke coach since **Tom Butters** led the Blue Devils to 24 ACC wins from 1968-70. No other Blue Devil coach has had more than 11 ACC wins in his first three years.

### Patrick Enjoys Successful Season

Junior **Brian Patrick** enjoyed the best season of his collegiate career. A career .210 hitter entering the season, Patrick hit .344 during his junior campaign. Patrick entered the season with five doubles, one triple, one home run and 23 RBIs in 84 career games. This year he posted a team-best 17 doubles, four triples, five home runs and 52 RBIs. Patrick also pitched for the first time in his collegiate career and was 2-4 with an 8.54 ERA in 13 appearances.

### Broadway Boasts Career-Best Numbers

Junior 1B Larry Broadway hit .323 with 15 doubles, two triples and eight home runs. He had 53 RBIs and led the ACC with 0.86 walks per game. He established new personal season highs in runs, RBIs, home runs, triples and walks.

### Blue Devils Among ACC Leaders

Several Blue Devils were ranked among the individual leaders in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2002. Junior 1B Larry Broadway led the league with 0.86 walks per game. Senior SS Kevin Kelly and junior OF Brian Patrick tied for fourth in the ACC with four triples.

### Mr. Versatility: Layden Dubbed One of Nation's Top Frosh by Baseball America

Freshman P/OF **Tim Layden** was named to *Baseball America's* midseason Freshman All-America Team as a utility player. The Deer Park, N.Y., native hit .282 with 11 doubles, three home runs and 36 RBIs. On the mound, he was third on the team with four wins and second with 55 strikeouts. An extremely versatile player, Layden played four positions during the year (LF, RF, 1B, P) in addition to serving as the designated hitter. He played three positions (LF, RF, P) in the Blue Devils' 10-8 win over Brown on March 30, hitting a three-run homer and picking up his first collegiate save.

### Caradonna's Hitting Streak Snapped at 14 Games

Junior C **Troy Caradonna's** season-long hitting streak was snapped at 14 games with an 0-2 day at the plate on May 5 against Florida State. The Tampa., Fla., native hit .375 (21-56) with four doubles, eight runs and 10 RBIs during the streak, raising his batting average from .270 to .307.

#### Sember Impressive in April

Freshman LHP **Ryan Sember** was impressive out of the bullpen in his first collegiate season. The Blue Devils' first lefty out of the pen, Sember allowed just two earned runs in 10.1 innings for a 1.74 ERA in nine April appearances.

### Duke's Freshmen Make Immediate Impact

The Duke baseball 2002 freshman class made its presence known. Four Blue Devil freshmen were regulars in Duke's starting lineup. OF/P/DH Tim Layden played in 54 games, starting 50, offensively and made 16 appearances, including 10 starts, on the mound. He hit .282 with three home runs and was 4-8 as a pitcher. OF Mike Miello started 28 of the 43 games in which he appeared. He hit .209 with a double, two triples, a home run and 17 RBIs. 3B Aaron Kempster started 29 games for the Blue Devils before injuring his shoulder and has seen action in eight others. He hit .285 with five doubles, a triple and 16 RBIs. 3B Grant Stanley shared action with Kempster, starting 33 of the 40 games in which he played. He is hit .228 with nine doubles and one home run. RHP Paul DeMarco made 21 appearances on the mound and started seven games. He was 3-4 with a 5.49 ERA in 59.0 innings and tallied a team-high three saves. LHP Ryan Sember tied for the team high with 22 appearances, including three starts. He was 1-0 with a 6.75 ERA. C Blake Walker played in 34 games, starting 12, and hit .231.

## Blue Devil Offense Erupts against Terrapins

After scoring just nine runs in their previous five games, the Blue Devils erupted with a season-high 19 runs against Maryland on April 27. The 19 runs were the most by the Blue Devils since the 1999 squad scored 26 against Coppin State on March 16. Duke's offensive outburst continued on April 28, when the Blue Devils scored 10 runs in a rain-shortened six-inning game. In the threegame series with the Terrapins, Duke hit .324

On May 13 against North Carolina, junior Troy Caradonna got his first start of the season at first base, junior Larry Broadway started for the first time in left field and freshman Blake Walker started behind the plate. Freshman Tim Layden started at first base on May 12 while Broadway started in right field. On April 17 against Davidson, Caradonna got the first start of his career at third base while Walker was the starting catcher. Duke also juggled the lineup April 12-14 at N.C. State. Junior Doug Bechtold and freshman Mike Miello shared time at centerfield while freshmen Grant Stanley and Aaron Kempster shared duties at third base. Several familiar faces showed up in new positions on April 10 at East Carolina. Broadway played right field for the first time this year, while Layden started at first base for the second time this season.

## Duke Limits No. 1 Clemson to Season-Low Runs Total

Despite dropping three close games to the top-ranked Clemson Tigers April 19-21, the Blue Devils contained Clemson like no other team has this season. Clemson scored just 11 runs in the three-game series, the lowest number of runs the Tigers have scored in a three-game series this year. Clemson, which is among the nation's leaders with 8.6 runs per game, scored just 3.7 runs per contest against the Blue Devils.

### Alleva Named ACC Baseball Player of the Week

Junior RHP Jeff Alleva was named the ACC Player of the Week on April 15 after leading the Blue Devils to victory over N.C. State on April 14. Alleva pitched nine strong innings, allowing just two runs (one earned) on six hits and two walks while striking out seven

to pick up his team-leading fifth win of the season.

### Blue Devils Tally Seven Extra-Base Hits vs. Davidson

The Duke Blue Devils tallied seven extrabase hits against Davidson on April 17, the most since recording seven against Princeton on March 16. It was the second-highest total by Duke this season. The Blue Devils recorded 10 extra-base hits on March 6 against North Carolina A&T. Duke's three triples on April 17 were the most by the Blue Devils in a game this year.

#### **Home Sweet Home**

Jack Coombs Field has been a comfortable home for the Blue Devils the last two years. After posting an 18-13 record at home last season, Duke again recorded 18 wins at historic Jack Coombs Field this year.

#### **Duke in Extra Innings**

The Blue Devils' 10-inning win at Old Dominion on May 15 was their seventh extrainning game of the year. Duke was 5-2 in those contests, defeating Cincinnati, Elon, Brown, N.C. State and ODU and falling to Virginia and Georgia Tech.

# Twenty-Five Duke Games Decided by Two Runs or Less

Twenty-five of Duke's 58 games, including eight conference contests and one ACC Tournament game, were decided by two runs or less this season. The Blue Devils posted a 13-12 record in those contests, including a 5-3 mark in one-run games. In Duke's 19 games against ranked opponents, the Blue Devils dropped six by two runs or less.

# Patrick Hits Grand Slam against Brown

A day after recording five hits against Brown, junior OF **Brian Patrick** blasted a grand slam against the Bears on March 30. Patrick's grand slam over the left-center field wall helped lift the Blue Devils to a 10-8 victory in the second game of the doubleheader. Patrick was 8-16 with a triple, home run, two walks, a stolen base, five runs scored and eight RBIs in the four-game series with Brown.

# DeMarco Delivers against Brown Bears

Freshman RHP **Paul DeMarco** turned in the longest outing of his career on March 30, pitching seven solid innings against Brown

in his fourth start of the year. DeMarco allowed two runs on just four base hits in the game and did not give up a base hit after the third inning. He faced the minimum nine batters in his final three innings of work.

#### **Broadway Blasts Brown**
