The First Pitch

The Duke Blue Devils posted a 2-2 record in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament to finish the year with an 18-36 mark. The Blue Devils defeated Maryland in the first round of the tournament before defeating No. 17 Clemson with a 7-4 victory in an elimination game.

Around the Horn

Four Blue Devil seniors -- RHP **Jeff Alleva**, C **Troy Caradonna**, RF **Brian Patrick** and student assistant coach **Kevin Perry** -- graduated from Duke on May 11... **Troy Caradonna** finished his collegiate career with an 11-game hitting streak. During the streak, he hit a team-best .455 with six doubles, 10 runs scored and 10 runs batted in. Caradonna raised his batting average from .269 on April 27 to .309 during the streak... With 31 appearances on the mound, sophomore RHP **Blake Walker** tied for second place in Duke's single-season record books. Walker, who served as a reserve catcher and infielder in 2002, tied **Teddy Sullivan** in the record books. Sullivan made 31 pitching appearances in 1999... Duke had a lot of close calls in 2003, with 15 games decided by just one run. The Blue Devils, who had a total of eight one-run games in 2002, posted an 8-7 record in one-run games in 2003... **Brian Patrick** compiled a career-best 18-game hitting streak from March 22 to April 26. He led the Blue Devils with a .329 batting average, six home runs, three triples, 42 RBIs and 42 runs scored in 2003... The Blue Devils demonstrated their increased team speed on the bases in 2003. With 52 stolen bases, Duke stole 17 more bases in 2003 than in 2002. Ten different Blue Devils stole a base in 2003, led by freshman SS **Adam Murray**, who swiped 11 bases... The Blue Devils defeated No. 14 Clemson on May 5, the first time Duke has knocked off a ranked opponent since upsetting third-ranked Wake Forest on May 18, 2002. The Blue Devils repeated that feat on May 23, knocking off No. 17 Clemson in the ACC Tournament... Junior RHP **Kevin Thompson** was named a "Louisville Slugger" National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball* on March 3 after his one-hitter against Buffalo on March 2. Thompson came within one strike of a perfect game and finished with a one-hit shutout and his first win since April 7, 2001. Thompson recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts in the seven-inning game.

Blue Devils Win Two in the ACC Tournament

The Duke Blue Devils won two ACC Tournament games for the first time since 1997 and sent the 17th-ranked Clemson Tigers packing. Duke defeated Clemson, 7-4, in an elimination game on May 23, three days after knocking off Maryland, 5-3.

Four Blue Devils Earn Bachelor's Degrees

Four Blue Devil seniors -- RHP Jeff Alleva, C Troy Caradonna, RF Brian Patrick and student assistant coach Kevin Perry -- graduated from Duke on May 11. Alleva and Caradonna graduated with degrees in sociology. Patrick majored in both sociology and history. Perry graduated with a degree in public policy studies. All four student-athletes rank among Duke's career leaders on the diamond as well.

Caradonna Ends Career with 11-Game Hitting Streak

Senior C Troy Caradonna concluded his collegiate career with an 11-game hitting streak, his longest of the season. Caradonna, who recorded at least two hits in seven of those 11 contests, hit a team-best .455 (20-for-44) with six doubles, 10 runs scored and 10 RBIs during the streak. He raised his batting average from .269 on April 27 to .309 to end the season. Caradonna was second on the team with a .309 batting average, 14 doubles, three home runs, 38 RBIs and 86 total bases on the year.

Alleva Climbs Duke's Career Pitching Charts

Senior RHP Jeff Alleva climbed Duke's career pitching leaders lists during the 2003 season. With a team-high 78.0 innings pitched in 2003, Alleva finished his career ranked 10th place all-time at Duke with 264.1 innings pitched. Alleva is third all-time with 80 pitching appearances in his career. He ranks sixth on Duke's career list with eight saves, ninth with 34 starts and 12th with 173 strikeouts.

Caradonna Ranks Among Blue Devil Career Leaders

C Troy Caradonna moved up Duke's career offensive leaders lists during his senior year. The Tampa, Fla., native ranks tied for third in games played (219), fourth in games started (217), fourth in at bats (821), 10th in hits (246) and tied for 11th in RBIs (132).

Patrick Cracks Duke's Career Charts

Senior RF Brian Patrick wrote his name into the Duke record books in 2003. Patrick is tied for 12th all-time at Duke with 194 games played and 13th with eight triples. His 117 RBIs rank him 15th on Duke's career list.

Perry Finishes Career as Student Assistant Coach

After spending three years on the mound for the Blue Devils, senior Kevin Perry concluded his career as a student assistant coach. A native of Bremen, Ga., Perry ranks tied for sixth all-time at Duke with 72 appearances on the mound. His 27 appearances in each of his first two years rank fifth on Duke's single season list. He graduated from Duke on May 11 with a bachelor's degree in public policy studies.

Walker's 31 Appearances Rank Third on Season Chart

With a team-high 31 pitching appearances in 2003, sophomore RHP Blake Walker ranks tied for second place in Duke's single season record book. Walker, who did not pitch as a freshman last year, was 3-1 with two saves and a 5.31 ERA.

Layden Leads Duke Past Clemson with Career Day

Sophomore LHP Tim Layden turned in the best performance of his career May 23 in the ACC Tournament to lead the Blue Devils past Clemson, 7-4, in an elimination game. Layden allowed two runs and tied his career high with eight strikeouts in seven innings against the Tigers. He also paced Duke at the plate, tying his career high with three hits.

Socorro Extends Hitting Streak to Nine Games

Freshman LF Javier Socorro extended his hitting streak to nine games with hits against Maryland and Florida State in the ACC Tournament. The Miami, Fla., native hit .333 during the streak, which tied his career high. Socorro also recorded a nine-game hitting streak in April.

Alleva Pitches Complete Game in ACC Tournament

Senior RHP Jeff Alleva pitched the second complete game of his career to lead Duke to victory over Maryland in the ACC Tournament. Alleva allowed three runs, including two on a ninth-inning home run, and struck out five in the 5-3 win.

Blue Devils Swipe Five Bases Against Maryland

Duke stole five bases in a game against Maryland on May 20 in the ACC Tournament, the third time the Blue Devils stole five bases in a game this season. Five different Blue Devils stole a base against the Terrapins. Duke previously stole five bases against ODU on May 12 and six bases against N.C. State on April 6.

Hernandez Ties Career High with Four Hits against FSU

Freshman C **Brian Hernandez** matched his best career game with four hits against Florida State on May 19. A native of Boynton Beach, Fla., Hernandez went 4-for-5 with one run and one RBI against the top-ranked Seminoles.

Landrum Blazes Monarchs with Three Base Hits

Sophomore CF **Senterrio Landrum** used his speed to tally three base hits and a stolen base against the Old Dominion Monarchs on May 12. Landrum reached on infield singles in each of his first two at bats and then hit his second triple of the year to the p in right-center field. Landrum hit .253 on the year.

Duke Knocks Off 14th-Ranked Clemson

Duke defeated No. 14 Clemson, 7-6, on May 5, in Clemson, S.C. It was Duke's first win over a ranked opponent since the Blue Devils upset No. 3 Wake Forest on May 18, 2002. Freshmen **Adam Murray** and **Michael Golom** led Duke with two hits apiece in the game.

Walker Makes Smooth Transition to the Mound

After spending the 2002 season as a reserve catcher and infielder, sophomore RHP **Blake Walker** has moved to the mound this season. The La Jolla, Calif., native has made a team-high 31 appearances in 2003 and posted a 5.37 ERA. Walker was third on the team with three wins and tied for the team lead with two saves.

Layden Does Double Duty for Blue Devils

With nine doubles in his last 15 games, sophomore LHP/1B **Tim Layden** led Duke with 16 doubles in 2003. Ten of Layden's last 16 hits were for extra bases. Since April 23, Layden recorded nine doubles, one triple and three singles. Layden made 13 appear-

ances on the mound in 2003 in addition to playing first base.

Patrick Paces Blue Devil Offense

Senior RF **Brian Patrick** picked up his senior year where he left off in 2002. After batting .344 with 17 doubles and 52 RBIs as a junior, Patrick led the 2003 team with a .329 batting average, six home runs, three triples, 42 RBIs and 42 runs scored. He also led the team with 106 total bases and a .505 slugging percentage.

Six Blue Devils Among ACC Leaders

Several Blue Devils are among the statistical leaders in the Atlantic Coast Conference as of May 16. Senior RF **Brian Patrick** is 10th in the ACC in batting average. Senior RHP **Jeff Alleva** ranks tied for eighth in starts. Junior RHP **Kevin Thompson** is tied for second in the ACC with one complete game shut-out. Switch-hitting Caradonna Demonstrates Versatility

A three-year starter at catcher for the Blue Devils, senior **Troy Caradonna** demonstrated his versatility in 2003. The Tampa, Fla., native started at catcher, first base and designated hitter his senior year. A left-handed hitter his first three years at Duke, Caradonna was a switch-hitter in his senior campaign. He was second on the team with a .309 batting average, three home runs, 14 doubles and 38 RBIs. Caradonna hit his first home run from the right side against Elon on March 7.

Fifteen of Duke's Games Decided by One Run

The Blue Devils had 15 one-run games in 2003, nearly doubling last year's total of eight one-run contests. Duke posted an 8-7 record in one-run games in 2003, including a 2-1 mark in extra-inning contests.

Socorro Heats Up

After hitting .243 through the first 30 games of his collegiate career, freshman OF **Javier Socorro** turned up the heat offensively. The Miami, Fla., native hit .281 with two doubles, a home run and a team-best eight stolen bases over the final 23 games, raising his season average to .256. He recorded a nine-game hitting streak in both April and May.

The Duke freshmen made an impact on the Blue Devil baseball program early in their collegiate careers. The 2003 freshman class compiled 210 starts, led by SS **Adam Murray** (54 starts), OF **Javier Socorro** (53 starts) and 2B **Michael Golom** (47 starts). Murray led Duke with 11 stolen bases and 25 walks, was second with 39 runs scored and third with a .302 batting average. Socorro was second on the squad with nine stolen bases. Golom's 29 runs were the third-most on the team. RHP **Russell Durfee** tied for second on the team with 11 starts on the mound.

Patrick Compiles Career-Best Hitting Streak

Senior RF **Brian Patrick** compiled a career-best 18-game hitting streak from March 22 to April 26 and recorded two or more hits in eight straight contests. During the 18-game streak, Patrick hit .438 with four doubles, a triple, five home runs, 19 runs scored and 15 runs batted in. He had 53 total bases and a .726 slugging percentage during the streak. Patrick, who led Duke with 21 multiple-hit games, had two or more hits in eight consecutive games from April 12 to April 23 and hit .531 with a 1.031 slugging percentage during that stretch. Two-Sport Star Landrum Shines on the Diamond

Two-sport standout **Senterrio Landrum** made his presence known on the baseball diamond after starting all 12 games at wide receiver for the Blue Devils on the gridiron in the fall. The sophomore from Sweet Water, Ala., hit .253 and was third on the team with eight stolen bases. He started 48 games

in the outfield and missed the other six while participating in Duke's spring football practice.

Blue Devils are Thieves on the Basepaths

With 52 stolen bases, the Blue Devils recorded 17 more stolen bases in 2003 than they did in 2002. Freshman SS **Adam Murray** paced Duke with 11 stolen bases, surpassing last year's leader, **Kevin Kelly**, who swiped eight stolen bases. Freshman LF **Javier Socorro** was second with nine stolen bases and sophomore CF **Senterrio Landrum** was third with eight stolen bases. The Blue Devils were successful on 69.3 percent of their attempts in 2003, stealing 52 bases in 75 attempts. The Blue Devils' six were the most for Duke in a game since April 11, 2001, when the Blue Devils stole six bases against North Carolina A&T. Duke swiped five bases against Old Dominion on May 12 and against Maryland on May 20.

Blue Devils Impressive in Non-Conference Games

In 27 games against non-conference opponents, the Blue Devils compiled a 3.42 ERA while allowing opposing batters to hit just .242 against them. Duke pitchers struck out 216 opposing non-conference batters. Duke hitters also fared better than their counterparts in non-league games, hitting .298. Duke posted a 14-13 record in non-conference games in 2003.

Duke's Starting Pitchers Step Up Against Maryland

Duke's starting pitchers turned in impressive performances in the series against Maryland April 26-27, compiling a 3.63 ERA in 22.1 innings pitched. Senior **Jeff Alleva** allowed just two runs in 8.0 innings pitched in the win against the Terrapins on April 26. Freshman **Russell Durfee** allowed three runs in 6.1 innings on April 26 before the game was suspended because of thunderstorms. Junior **Kevin Thompson** took a two-out shutout into the ninth inning on April 27 before being chased from the game. The trio struck out 16 batters and walked just five. Excluding Sunday's ninth inning, the trio compiled a 2.01 earned run average.

Patrick Shows Power at North Carolina

Senior RF **Brian Patrick** put on a power display against North Carolina April 19-20.

Patrick hit two home runs in the second game of the doubleheader against the Tar Heels on April 19, becoming the first Blue Devil to hit two out of the park in a game since **Larry Broadway** did so on March 18, 2002. Patrick then added his third home run of the series on April 20.

Stanley Sets Career High with Eight-Game Hit Streak

Sophomore INF **Grant Stanley** set a new career best with an eight-game hitting streak from March 29 to April 19. During the streak, Stanley hit .370 with three doubles, four runs scored and three RBIs. On the year, the Henderson, Nev., native was fourth on the team with a .282 batting average.

Socorro's First Career Home Run Extends Hitting Streak

Freshman OF **Javier Socorro** hit the first home run of his career to lead off the game April 16 at Davidson, extending his hitting streak to eight games. Socorro extended his career-best hitting streak to nine games against North Carolina on April 19.

Perry Earns First Career Win

Redshirt freshman RHP **Jim Perry** earned his first career win on April 16 against Davidson, allowing one earned run on two hits and a walk in a career-high 4.1 innings pitched. A native of Huntington, W.Va., Perry led the Blue Devils with a 1.75 earned run average. He recorded a career high with four strikeouts on April 5 against N.C. State.

Socorro Swipes Career-High Three Bases

After recording just one stolen base in the first 30 games of his collegiate career, freshman OF **Javier Socorro** stole three bases on April 6 against N.C. State. He added two stolen bases on May 12 against Old Dominion and was second on the team with nine stolen bases on the year.

Blue Devils Steal Six Bases in Game Against N.C. State

Duke stole a season-high six bases against N.C. State on April 6, the most by the Blue Devils in two years. Senior **Troy Caradonna** and sophomores **Tim Layden** and **Grant Stanley** stole one base each against the Wolfpack while freshman **Javier Socorro** had a career-high three stolen bases. On April 11, 2001, Duke stole six bases against North Carolina A&T.

Murray Hits in Seven Consecutive Games

Freshman SS **Adam Murray** recorded a seven-game hitting streak from March 23 to April 5. He hit .357 with 10 hits, three walks, three stolen bases and five runs scored during the streak. Murray was third on the squad with a .302 batting average and led the Blue Devils with 11 stolen bases.

Loftin Hits First Home Run of His Career against ECU

Sophomore INF **Adam Loftin** hit the first home run of his career on April 2 at East Carolina, a solo shot over the centerfield wall. A native of Raleigh, Loftin is hit .227 in 28 games.

Hernandez Drills First Career Triple

Freshman INF/C **Brian Hernandez** drilled his first career triple to right field on April 2 against East Carolina. He tallied seven doubles and one triple in his young career.

Hernandez Records Career Day

Freshman C **Brian Hernandez** had the best day of his collegiate career on March 26 against Davidson. The Boynton Beach, Fla., native went 4-for-5 with a double, run scored and two RBIs in the contest.

Burke Returns from "Tommy John" Surgery

Junior RHP **Greg Burke** made his return to the mound on March 15 against Brown, pitching the first three innings for the Blue Devils. Burke, who had "Tommy John" surgery last May, allowed two runs on five hits and a walk while striking out four.

Thompson Named National Player of the Week

Junior RHP **Kevin Thompson** was named a "Louisville Slugger" National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball* on March 3 after his one-hitter against Buffalo on March 2. Thompson came within one strike of a perfect game and finished with a one-hit shut-out and his first win since April 7, 2001. Thompson recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts in the seven-inning game, the most by a Blue Devil pitcher since **Stephen Cowie** struck out 13 in nine innings on April 17, 1999. Thompson allowed no walks while facing just one batter more than the minimum.

A two-time All-ACC selection and 1992 All-American, Quinton McCracken is Duke's career leader in triples and stolen bases. He is third on Duke's career hits list and fourth in career batting average. McCracken is in his second year with the Arizona Diamondbacks. Duke's career leader with 30 wins and 51 games started, Scott Schoeneweis is in his fifth year with the Anaheim Angels, with whom he won the World Series championship last year.

OF Quinton McCracken is in his ninth season in the majors and his second with the Arizona Diamondbacks. P Chris Capuano started the season in Class AAA Tucson before making his major league debut with the Arizona Diamondbacks in May. OF Ryan Jackson is back in Durham, playing for the Class AAA Bulls in the Devil Rays organization. C J.D. Alleva is playing for Kansas City's Class A affiliate, the Wilimington Blue Rocks. 1B Larry Broadway is playing for the Savannah Sand Gnats, the Class A affiliate for the Expos. INF Kevin Kelly is playing for the Hagerstown Suns, San Francisco's Class A squad.

Broadway Rated Expos' No. 10 Prospect

Former Blue Devil Larry Broadway was ranked the No. 10 prospect in the Montreal Expos' organization by *Baseball America* entering the 2003 season. The top eight pros-

pects, according to the magazine, are pitchers. Third baseman **Scott Hodges** and Broadway are the only two position players to make the list. Broadway was drafted in the third round of the 2002 draft by the Expos after his junior year at Duke and is playing for the Savannah Sand Gnats this season.
