Megan Cooke Carcagno was named Duke University's second head rowing coach on July 28, 2015, as announced by Duke Vice President and Director of Athletics Dr. Kevin White. Cooke Carcagno had spent the last seven years as a member of the Wisconsin coaching staff, including the 2015 season as associate head coach.

"Megan Cooke Carcagno is an outstanding addition to the Duke coaching staff as the head rowing coach," Dr. White said. "Not only does she understand the tremendous effort it takes to become a world-class athlete, she is bright, enthusiastic, and charismatic – and precisely the right fit for Duke Rowing at this time. For several years, Megan has played an integral role in the success of Wisconsin's formidable rowing program. Her background as an elite competitor at California and the United States National Team, as well as her innate ability to relate easily with today's student-athletes, will serve Duke well as the head coach. We cannot wait for her to make an immediate – and permanent – impact on the Duke Rowing program."

Cooke Carcagno replaces Robyn Horner, who retired in May of 2015 after starting the Blue Devil program and running it for 17 seasons.

"I have always looked at this university and athletic department with a sense of awe, and I am thrilled to now be a part of it," Cooke Carcagno said. "After seeing how much the department was doing for the team, and how much enthusiasm and passion they had for the sport, I knew right away that Duke would be a great home for me."

"I can't wait to take the next giant step with the current student-athletes, and make a huge push to turn Duke into a rowing powerhouse. The Duke student is known to be exceptional, and Duke Rowing will mirror those ambitions."

Cooke Carcagno was with the Badger program for seven years, one as an associate head coach, one as a varsity assistant and five as the freshmen coach. After her first campaign in Madison, she was named the 2009 Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA) Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year after directing the UW novice crews to Big Ten titles in the novice eight and second novice eight events in 2009. The novice eight also took first in the NCAA Central Regional regatta.

She earned a second CRCA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year award in 2012 and was nominated again in 2015.

In the spring of 2015, Cooke Carcagno helped the Badgers ensure their eighth consecutive NCAA Championship selection and primarily coached the second varsity eight, which placed ninth at the NCAA Championship.

During each of her five seasons coaching the UW freshmen, her novice eight placed in the top three at the Big Ten championships, while the second novice eight won four titles and finished second the other season. In 2010, Cooke Carcagno helped the UW novice crews to their fifth and eighth Big Ten titles, respectively, on the way to a Big Ten Championship crown for Wisconsin in openweight rowing. She also directed the novice eight to a win in the grand final and the second novice eight to a win in the petite final at the NCAA Central/South Sprints.

Prior to joining Wisconsin, Cooke Carcagno coached for six years following her graduation from California. Her last stop before joining the collegiate rankings was with coaching masters rowers at the Carnegie Lake Rowing Association, USRowing's Club of the Year.

She spent her first year out of Cal as an assistant freshmen coach for the Bears, while also coaching the Oakland Strokes, Inc. club and at Marin Rowing Association during the 2002-03 season. Cooke Carcagno moved on to New Jersey to train with the U.S. national team, all the while giving private instruction to numerous high school athletes in the region.

As a rower at Cal, Cooke Carcagno twice earned first team All-American honors to go along with a pair of first team all-region and first team All-Pac 10 accolades. Co-captain as a junior and senior, she helped the varsity eight to third at the 2002 NCAA Championships and fourth at the 2000 event.

Cooke Carcagno, a Los Gatos, Calif., native, spent four years with the U.S. national team, from 2004-07. As part of the 2006 U.S. World Champion women's eight, she helped establish a world record for Team USA. A 2006 Henley-on-Thames champion, she also won a gold medal at the 2006 Lucerne World Cup in the women's pair and a silver in the women's four without coxswain at the 2001 World Under-23 Championships.

Cooke Carcagno earned a bachelor's of arts degree in psychology from California in 2002.

Duke rowing head coach Megan Cooke Carcagno made Chuck Rodosky the first addition to her staff on August 7, 2015.

In May of 2015, Rodosky completed his sixth season as an assistant coach at Ohio State, working primarily with the first and second novice eight crews as well as the varsity four. Rodosky capped his Buckeye career with his third consecutive NCAA title as Ohio State became the first team in NCAA history to win three consecutive national championships. The Buckeyes claimed an individual national title in the first varsity eight, a runner-up finish in the second varsity eight and fifth place in the first varsity four.

Rodosky helped the first novice eight to a silver medal and the second novice eight to a bronze medal at the 2014 Big Ten Championships as Ohio State won its second consecutive Big Ten title and third in four years with a championship-record 164 points. After conquering the Big Ten, the Buckeyes were victorious at the NCAA championships for the second year in a row.

In 2013, Rodosky guided the first novice eight to a second-consecutive gold medal at the Big Ten championships. The Scarlet and Gray went on to win the 2013 Big Ten Championship and the 2013 NCAA Championship.

At the 2012 Big Ten Championships, Rodosky led the Buckeyes to a gold medal in the first novice eight and a silver medal in the second novice eight. In 2011, Rodosky coached the first novice eight to a silver medal and the second novice eight to a bronze at the Big Ten championships. In 2010, Rodosky guided the first novice eight to a third-place finish and the second novice eight to a second-place showing at the Big Ten championships.

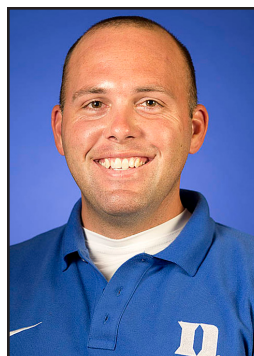
Prior to his role with Ohio State, Rodosky served as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Iowa women's rowing program (2006-10). Rodosky guided the Hawkeye first novice eight to a third-place finish at the 2007 Big Ten Championships and the second novice eight to a third place at the 2008 Big Ten Championships.

Before coaching at Iowa, Rodosky was an assistant coach at Trinity College in Hartford, Conn. (2005-06). Rodosky brought in an unprecedented recruiting class in terms of numbers as the Bantams fielded a first and second novice eight for the first time in program history. The first novice eight finished the season with an undefeated record, capturing a New England Rowing Conference championship and placing second at the ECAC championships. Trinity concluded the 2006 season with a third-place team finish at the NCAA Division III championships.

Rodosky began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant coach at Ohio State. In his first three seasons with the Buckeyes (2003-05), Rodosky guided several boats to top-three finishes at both conference and regional championships. In 2005, the Scarlet and Gray second varsity four captured an Aramark South/Central Region Championship. As a team, Ohio State concluded the 2005 season with a fourth-place finish at the NCAA championships. The first and second novice eights finished second at the Central Region championships in 2003 and 2004, while the second varsity four and second novice eight both placed second at the 2003 Big Ten Championships.

Rodosky also has experience coaching at U.S. national development camps. He participated in the 2000 NYAC U.S. Development Camp as well as the 2001 Nereid U.S. Development Camp. He also holds US Rowing Level III coaching certification.

A rower (1995-99) and team captain (1997-99) at Bowling Green State University, Rodosky earned his bachelor's degree in accounting in 1999.



Chase Graham
Assistant Coach

Duke rowing head coach Megan Cooke Carcagno completed her first Blue Devil staff August 10, 2015, with the hiring of Chase Graham.

Graham joins the Duke staff after four years as the head junior girls coach at the Saugatuck Rowing Club in Westport, Conn. He has been involved in the sport for 16 years.

With Saugatuck, Graham helped the 2015 varsity 8 and varsity lightweight 8 to the Youth National Championship. His varsity 8 went undefeated and took first place at the Head of the Charles, San Diego Crew Classic, Youth National Championship and Club National Championship.

A year earlier, in 2014, his varsity lightweight 8 claimed second place at the Youth National Championship while his 4+ was the Club National Champion.

Graham began rowing at Parkersburg South High School, where he competed for midwest and scholastic national championships. After high school Graham went on to row at Marietta College from 2003-07. He was the team's Most Improved Oarsman recipient in 2004.

He rowed with the varsity 8 for three years and helped lead the team to a Varsity 8 Dad Vail Championship in 2006. Graham earned a bachelor's degree in management and minor in sport management in 2007.

While pursuing a master's in education, Graham continued training in the men's pair and won a club national championship as well as claiming a third place finish at the Canadian Henley Regatta. During his time training and completing his education he served as a women's graduate assistant coach at Marietta College for two years. During that time, he helped lead his squad to a Mid Atlantic Division 3 championship while also playing an important role in recruiting.

In 2009, Graham began coaching the women's rowing program at Fairfield University. During his first year at Fairfield, he led his squad to the program's first Dad Vail Championship.

Graham was named the Saugatuck girls head coach in 2010. His crews have consistently earned medals at regattas such as Head of the Charles, Northeast Regional Championships and the Youth National Championships.

In 2013, Graham coached the women's single at the Junior World Rowing Championships in Trakai, Lithuania.

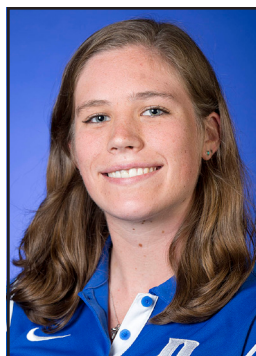

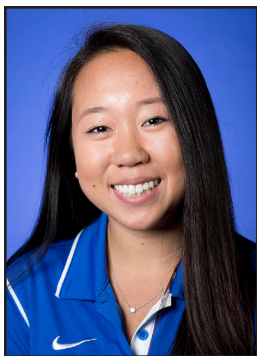
